> The meeting this month focused on a better process to get applicants into the program. There was a brief planning meeting on the upcoming Adult and Junior Leadership programs for the upcoming month.




> There was 1 class of Alive @ 25 taught during the month of January at the Greer PD..



Stolen guns from our jurisdiction and Spartanburg were recovered during a traffic stop






January Collisions on Roadways

### Criminal Investigations Division – Lt. Eric Pressley

Investigators with the Criminal Investigations Division (CID) were assigned thirty-four new cases in January. Investigators were able to successfully clear nine cases during the month with five coming by arrest. Several of the more significant events for the month are as follows:

- Det. Arterburn conducted three separate interviews regarding Blue Ridge Savings.
- Det. Arterburn is following up on two home invasions that occurred on the same night.
- Detective Bash was assigned to follow-up with a CDV incident that was initially investigated by patrol. He has conducted an extensive investigation and has leveled additional charges against the suspect to include Attempted Murder and Kidnapping.
- Det. Bash has recovered several firearms stolen from a storage unit. His investigation continues.
- Det. Wood was assigned two new cases involving Criminal Sexual Conduct and one Criminal Solicitation of a Minor.
- Sgt. O'Shields continues his investigation of the burglary at the South Carolina Gun Company.
- Detectives responded to call-back incidents for a total of twenty-eight hours in January.
- Vice secured twenty-two drug arrest warrants in January while serving twenty-four.
- Vice signed four search warrants in January.
- Vice completed a counterfeiting investigation that had been on-going for several months. Vice and ERT executed a search warrant at 101 James Ave. and arrested the subject of the investigation. Vice recovered numerous items relevant to the investigation, as well as a stolen car. The US Attorney has adopted the case.


- VA Weibel was assigned fifty-three cases requiring victim follow-up in January. She also spent nineteen hours assisting victims in City and General Sessions courts.
