VIII. Departmental Questions/Discussions

a) Athletics Division – Cory Holtzclaw thanked Travis Ware for all his years of volunteering and his dedication to the Parks and Recreation Department's football program.

Softball and Baseball Opening Day was held on April 9 at Century Park. Robbie Gravely was the Master of Ceremonies and Principal Marion Waters from Greer High School threw out the first pitch. In the absence of a concession stand at Century Park the Fudd's Truck, Calabash Wagon and the Sno-Hut Truck were on site to accommodate the players and patrons during league play.

Soccer games and practices are held at South Suber Road Park on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday evenings and on Saturdays.

Little Turner football camps are being held on Sundays for any kids who want to participate.

Adult Kickball free play will be held at Victor Park on May 11 and May 18 and the regular season will begin on May 25. Amanda Somers requested Cory email her the information to post at SSI.

b) Events Division –

Samuel Blaise Stone was born on April 1, 2016 to Ashlyn and Sean Stone.

International Festival was attended by over 4,000 people with 22 featured countries.

c) Cultural Arts Division –

Red Watson gave an update in the absence of Robin Byouk. Robin was holding dress rehearsal for Lion King, Jr.

Freedom Blast Mural entries can be turned in May 23 - 27.

Tall Tale Tuesdays and Tunes in the Park with Greer Idol will begin on June 7.

The next performance "We Got the Beat" will be held on July 29-31 at the Cannon Centre.

d) Grounds Division –

Bruce Viehman gave an update on the activities of the Grounds Division contained in the monthly reports.

The flower beds at the corners of Randall and Depot Street and Randall and Trade Street are being refurbished with a grant from Partnership For Tomorrow.

Amanda Somers commended the staff on how great all the facilities look.

e) Recreation Division –

Justin Miller reported summer camp registration began on March 14 with Victor completely full in 6 days and Needmore was completely filled in 3 weeks. There are waiting lists for both camps again this year. Interviews will be held during May for camp counselors.

The Senior Computer Class offered to senior citizens in the Greer area, taught by Kay Young, will focus on basic computer functions and the internet. There were 24 openings for the class and there are 124 people on the waiting list.

IX. <u>Financial Reports</u> – Program Funds

a) Red Watson gave an update on the 5 budgets in the department.

Ann Cunningham reported the City of Greer will be receiving \$111,000 from the Greenville County Tax Office. The money is from the City of Greer resident's tax payments charged by Greenville County for recreation. The money is earmarked specifically for recreation.

Kids Planet Assessment is being conducted by Leathers & Associates.

A trash containment area will be added behind the amphitheater area.

XII. <u>New Business</u>

a) Voting Via Email

Sally Wise informed the board research is still being conducted on the possibility of changing the Recreation Association by-laws to allow for voting via email.

b) City Auditorium

The City of Greer acquired the 100 Davis Avenue location in 1983. This facility may be renovated in 3 phases.

- Phase One is underway and should be ready early in fiscal 2016/2017. There will be rental space available for 4 long term artists to use as their art gallery. Robin Byouk will be supervising the activities of this facility.
- Phase Two will be at least a year away and will include visual and performing arts. Greer Cultural Arts Council will be based at the facility.

• Phase Three includes the addition of a balcony and a fire suppression system.

Ann Cunningham offered to show the members of the board the facility whenever they were available to see it.

I. <u>Call to Order</u>

Shelley Brown, Chairman, called to order the regular meeting of the Greer Recreation Association Board at 6:15pm on July 21, 2016 in Hall A at Greer City Hall.

II. <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u> Charles Ryan

VI. <u>Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting</u>

The minutes from the April 14, 2016 Recreation Association Board meeting were not approved as there was not a quorum. The minutes will be placed on the October 20, 2016 meeting agenda.

VII. <u>Committee Reports</u>

- a) DAV Alan Clark reported requests are being received for memorials to be added at Veteran's Park. Currently when names are added to the granite slabs a whole metal plate has to be cast and currently space is limited. Ann Cunningham, Bruce Viehman and Alan Clark met with Clayton Monuments to discuss possibilities for new memorials. There are 4 columns, if foundations were built higher than the shrubbery, names could be added one at a time by adding pavers to the columns. People would not be walking on the names, the chance for vandalism would be low and if more space for names was needed more columns could be added at a later date. Alan also gave an update on the activities and projects of the DAV this year.

- d) Girls' Softball No Report
- e) Soccer No Report
- f) Tennis Fred David presented a request for the clay courts to be lighted and the possibility of increasing the membership dues to support the lighting of the courts. Charles Ryan asked the cost for lighting the courts. Fred David gave the estimates he received were \$75,000 to light the clay courts and \$200,000 to light both the clay and hard courts. TAG members felt if the courts were lighted it would increase the membership. TAG members are concerned about the condition of the facility and the courts. TAG also suggested the possibility of a long-term vision to purchase property at the Victor Mill area for a new tennis facility or bundling an upgrade of the current facility, including the Tryon Recreation Center, with another project to accomplish the goals of improving the facility.

- g) Greer Cultural Arts (GCAC) No Report
- h) Greer Senior Citizens Club (SOAR) No Report

VIII. <u>Departmental Questions/Discussions</u>

- a) Athletics Division Cory Holtzclaw informed the board fall sports registrations were underway for baseball, softball, soccer, football, cheerleading, men's slow pitch softball and men's basketball. The 8U and 12U baseball teams won the District Championships. The department saw 33 straight days of baseball with the Frohawk Creek Scramble and the Upper State tournaments. Wresting Camp, partnered with Riverside High School, will be held July 25 29 with 30 kids registered. A new sport, knocker ball, will be coming soon.
- b) Events Division Ashlyn Stone reported Moonlight Movies will end on July 28 and thanked CPW for their sponsorship of the event. On August 5, the Food Truck Rollout will take place in City Park from 5:00pm 8:00pm. September 10 will see the first annual Railfest at City Hall and City Park from 10:00am 2:00pm. This event will partner with Operation Lifesaver and is specific to Greer and the Depot. The Cannon Centre is booked every weekend through September 2017 for Saturday rentals.
- c) Cultural Arts Division Red Watson gave a report on the Cultural Arts Division. "Lion King, Jr." was performed on April 14-17 and 22-24; Camp ARK performance of "James and the Giant Peach" was held on June 13-14 and 19-20; and "We Got the Beat" will be performed on July 29 31. Tunes in the Park was held June 10 July 15 with Greer Idol, Olivia Rae Wells, as the winner.
- d) Grounds Division Bruce Viehman informed the board athletic fields maintenance has been ongoing, Family Fest, Spring and Freedom Blast banners were installed and taken down, irrigations issues were repaired, earthen mounds were removed in preparation for the portable mounds at ball fields, fan louvers were repaired at Victor Gym, parking lots lines were painted, and storm damaged trees were removed or trimmed.
- e) Recreation Division Red Watson gave a report on the Recreation Division's activities. On June 4 the Children's Nature Zone event was held at Century Park Kids Planet. This educational event was offered in partnership with local garden clubs, a local plant nursery, City of Greer Storm Water Division and Greenville County Soil and Water Conservation Department showcasing nature and wildlife exhibits. The event saw over 250 people in attendance and the department hopes to make this an annual event. Summer Camps began on June 6 and only 2 weeks are left with over 140 campers at Needmore and Victor facilities. A plant day was held in June at Victor Gym where flowers and plants were planted at the entrances of the gym. The campers have been watering and weeding the gardens all summer and they were awarded July Business Yard of the Month by the Greer Council of Garden Clubs. A new program, Dog Obedience Classes,

will start at the Tryon Recreation Center on August 24; the cost is \$99 for 4 weeks. An Amateur Ham Radio Class is in the planning stages.

f) City Auditorium

Ann Cunningham gave an update on the progress of the facility. The name may change to "Center for the Arts". The awnings were hung and 2 benches, donated by BMW, were painted to match the awnings. The fire alarm should be completed by July 22, door hardware has been changed and artist studios and signs have been ordered. The Grounds Division has completed landscaping projects and the parking lot has been restriped. Applications for artists are being accepted until August 5. The rental fees are based on the square footage and ranges from \$75 to \$100 per month. Ann Cunningham offered to give the trustees a tour of the facility at their convenience.

g) Century Park

Red Watson gave an update on the progress of the project.

- Week 1 Pavement removed
- Week 2 Foundations laid
- Week 3 Underground plumbing and electric installed
- Week 4 Concrete slabs installed
- Week 5 Interior Walls constructed
- Week 6 Split face block added

Week 7 – Construction of buildings began

The project is ahead of schedule and the goal is for the facility to be functional for the fall athletic season.

- Shelley Brown commented on the great pictures and updates on the progress of the facility on social media.
- Charles Ryan requested an article be placed in the newspapers and Red Watson added once the final completion is done Steve Owens, Communications Manager, will issue a press release on the facility.

IX. <u>Financial Reports</u> – Program Funds

a) Red Watson reported the program funds are doing well. Baseball has seen an increase due in part to 3 tournaments being held this fiscal year and more all-star teams. There has been no change in the fee structure for these programs. Batting cage pads were installed at Victor Park. Pickle Ball lines will be added at the tennis courts, batting cages will be installed at H.R. Turner Park and a bulk order of football equipment will be placed.

X. Old Business

a) Voting via Email – Sally Wise gave a brief overview of what is involved in voting via email and also reported no other City of Greer boards or City Council use this method. As this process is very detailed and time consuming, the board agreed they would not recommend this form of voting. b) 2016/2017 Events

A list of upcoming events was included in the board's packet. Charles Ryan commended the department on a job well done and commented on the amount of work the staff is able to accomplish.

- c) 2016/2017 Highlighted Projects A list of projects was included in the board's packet.
- d) Nomination of Adhoc Representative DAV Adhoc Representative, Paul Shanks, nomination was not approved as there was not a quorum. The nomination will be placed on the October 20, 2016 meeting agenda.

XII. <u>New Business</u>

a) Freedom Blast 2016 Review

Marc Metcalf volunteered for the event and Charles Ryan and Shelley Brown were both in attendance at the event. Ann Cunningham thanked all the departments in the city for their assistance in honoring veterans and the military. Preston Johnson was honored during the Veterans Walk for his unwavering time and dedication to Freedom Blast and helping veterans. Ann also thanked all the military groups for their participation and all the volunteers and sponsors for their continued support. There were approximately 12,000 people in attendance. Freedom Blast will be held on June 24, 2017.

b) Meeting Dates

Some discussion regarding scheduling of the July meeting each year to August. Charles Ryan suggested the members should discuss further. No decision was made as there was not a quorum.

Shelley Brown, Chairman, called to order the regular meeting of the Greer Recreation Association Board at 6:20pm on November 1, 2016 in Hall A at Greer City Hall.

VI. Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting

The minutes from the April 14, 2016 and July 21, 2016 Recreation Association Board meetings were not approved as there was not a quorum. The minutes will be placed on the January 10, 2017 meeting agenda.

VII. <u>Committee Reports</u>

- a) DAV Allen Clark reported there were no pressing issues from the veteran's perspective. DAV Chapter 39 met with Ann Cunningham, Bruce Viehman and Clayton Monuments in May regarding using pavers on the front of the existing columns (picture attached). The next step is to discuss this option with the American Legion. The desire is to obtain estimates and to propose this option to Greer City Council. Allen gave a handout of the past several months DAV's projects to each trustee and staff member in attendance.

- e) Soccer No Report
- f) Tennis Red Watson gave an update on Patrick Wood's new hours, new programs and clinics. Pickleball lines are being added to one of the hard courts and is currently being played on 3 of the lower courts. Charles Ryan inquired about the number of courts with lights. There are 6 hard courts with lights; there are no lights on the clay courts. Red informed the board that the Tennis Association of Greer (TAG) received quotes on lighting the courts but the cost was prohibitive. Adding lights to the clay courts is on the Recreation Department's long term capital project list.
- g) Cultural Arts Neil Waldrop reported "Wonderland High" was successful. He thanked the City of Greer and the Parks and Recreation Department for the new Center for the Arts facility and for the part-time position to assist with the division's programs. Cultural Arts volunteers with be offering face painting at the Tree Lighting Ceremony on December 2 and will be entering a float in the Christmas Parade on December 4. Auditions for the next production, Madagascar, will be held on December 5 and 7 with call backs on December 12 at the new facility. The Foothills Philharmonic will perform on February 5 at the Cannon Centre and the Juried Arts Show will be held on March 24 at Greer City Hall. The division will be assisting with the International Festival to be held on April 22.

h) Greer Senior Citizens (SOAR) – No Report

VIII. Departmental Questions/Discussions

- a) Century Park Construction Project Red Watson reported the project is 95% complete. Three issues remain; HVAC, walkway bracing and gutter box for IT wires. A meeting is scheduled for November 2 with the contractor and architect. The final walk through with the Building and Development Codes Department should be within the next 2 weeks. Charles Ryan inquired where the project funding numbers stand in regard to the budget. Red reported the project is within the budgeted amount.
- b) City Auditorium Project Ann Cunningham reported Phase I has been completed with 3 artists renting studios and 3 artists currently being reviewed for rental space. Artwork will be hung in the gallery the week of November 7 in preparation for the opening celebration. Phase II is planned to begin in FY 17/18.
- c) Athletics Division David Holtzclaw reported the fall sports season has been completed for all recreation teams. The 10 academy soccer teams will continue playing through December and will compete in the State Cup on December 16 and 17. Football teams are playing championship games on November 1 with Mauldin and Simpsonville. The Golden Strip Football League has utilized City Stadium for the Jackets home games and visitors and community members love coming to the facility. Practices for youth wrestling begins November 1 with registrations completely full. The partnership with Riverside High School has been instrumental in building the program with over 45 wrestlers. Youth basketball registration is currently in process through November 28 for 8U, 10U and 12U participants. The basketball program is in partnership with the City of Mauldin Recreation Department. Games will be played at the Victor Gym and the Mauldin Sports Center. Spring registrations for baseball, girls' softball, soccer, adult basketball and adult softball will begin on January 3 for City of Greer residents and on January 9 for non-residents.
- d) Events Division Ashlyn Stone gave an update on rentals with only 2 Saturdays available for rent at the Cannon Centre for 2017. City Hall will be the venue for a wedding expo in January. The Food Truck Rollouts on August 5 and October 20 was host to 200-300 people at each event. Halloween Hoopla on October 27 and Hotel Transylvania 2 movie were big hits again this year. Ashlyn reminded everyone to come out on December 2 for the Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony at Greer City Park and Breakfast with Santa on December 3 at the Cannon Centre. Tickets go on sale November 7 from 4pm-6pm at City Hall.
- e) Cultural Arts Division Robin Byouk thanked the City of Greer for the new part-time position, her vehicle and the new Center for the Arts facility. She invited the board to attend the opening celebration on November 3 from 5:30pm-7:30pm. The Giving Thanks Arts Show will be held on November 15 at City Hall. The Cultural Arts Division will be partnering with the Events Division for the entertainment at the Tree Lighting event.

- f) Grounds Division Red Watson gave an update for the Grounds Division in the absence of Bruce Viehman. Bruce is attending Playground Safety Inspector recertification training. New infield dirt was installed at Century Park, the main water line at South Suber Road Park was repaired, a new scoreboard was installed at City Stadium and new LED lights were installed on the pond aerator at City Park. Free Little Libraries were installed at Needmore Recreation Center and Victor Park. A new track loader, low-boy trailer and a Toro Workman UTV were purchased. Christmas lights and pole wraps will be hung starting November 7.
- g) Recreation Division Justin Miller reported on the Recreation Division. The department partnered with the Police Department for National Night Out, the Greenville County Park Hop Closing Ceremony was held at City Park. Both summer camps completed 8 weeks of camp with 140 kids and the after school programs at the Needmore Recreation Center and the Victor Gym began in September. The Girls Scout Troup 811 Service Unit 636 installed a Free Little Library at Century Park and will maintain it for 2 years. Read Greenville was awarded a local grant from Partnership For Tomorrow (PFT) and installed 2 more little libraries at the Needmore Recreation Center and at Victor Park. The Cultural Arts Division painted the 2 libraries. The Parks and Recreation Department partnership with Greer CPW and the City of Greer Storm Water Division participated in the Friends of Lake Robinson Day. The Seniors Out and Around (SOAR) visited the Justus Orchard in Hendersonville, NC to pick apples and also traveled to Mt. Airy, NC to visit Mayberry for the day. New programs introduced were a dog obedience class with Ray Rucker as the instructor, a fitness class on Saturdays from 8:30am-9:30am at the Victor Gym and the Primrose Garden Club visited the Needmore After School Program to assist the children with creating 4 raised garden beds. The vegetables from these beds were prepared as part of the curriculum to teach the children about nutrition.

IX. <u>Financial Reports</u> – Program Funds

a) Red Watson reported the program funds are in good fiscal shape. A little extra money was spent in the football account this year for security and parking officials at City Stadium. These funds will assist with the following projects totaling \$16,800 scheduled to be completed this fiscal year: a bulk order of football equipment, pickle ball lines on 3 lower tennis courts, and batting cages at Turner Park. Both reimbursements from Greenville County Redevelopment Authority (GCRA) have been signed for last fiscal year's programs and contracts for this fiscal year's programs (Senior Computer Classes and Needmore Summer Camp).

X. <u>Director's Report</u>

b) Fair Labor Standards Act – Ann Cunningham gave a brief overview of the changes scheduled to take effect on December 1, 2016. Salaried employees being paid less than \$47,000 (current rate is \$23,000) status will change to hourly and will be compensated for hours over 40/week at time and a half. These employees cannot work off the clock and the maximum of 240 hours

is the threshold for accumulation of comp time. Ann informed the trustees that all supervisors and coordinators in the Parks and Recreation Department will be affected by this change. Charles Ryan suggested putting together a committee to look at options to remedy the situation of staff working over 40 hours/week and also increasing the departmental budget for additional staff both part-time and full-time. As this change occurred after the current fiscal year budget was completed, this option will be considered in the FY17/18. Ann informed the trustees that Mr. Driggers will be meeting with those staff members affected by these changes to discuss what options are available.

- c) South Suber Road Park Master Plan Ann Cunningham reported 2 meetings have been held with the Project Steering Committee and Alta Planning + Design to determine the best use of the additional 8 acres acquired at South Suber Road Park. Their final meeting will be held on December 15 to discuss recommendations to be presented to City Council.
- d) SCRPA Conference Ann Cunningham, Red Watson, Robin Byouk, Robbie Davis and Justin Miller attended the South Carolina Recreation and Parks Association State Conference held September 11-13 in Greenville, SC.
- e) NRPA Conference Ann Cunningham and Red Watson attended the National Recreation and Parks Association Conference in St. Louis, MO on October 3-7. Marc Metcalf asked Ann and Red what the best thing was they learned at the conference. Ann reported the information from vendors and the products available will be an invaluable resource to tap when the renovations for Kids Planet get underway. The many agencies from across the country in attendance networking together for resolutions on different issues they all face was also of great importance. Red reported the information obtained at one of the sessions on trails and incorporating thinking outside the box was valuable as the city continues its biking and trail ways project.
- f) LiveWell Healthy Out-of-School Time Silver Award The Needmore Afterschool Program partnered with LiveWell Greenville's Out of School Time workgroup starting with the 2015-2016 school year. The afterschool staff attended Coordinated Approach to Child Healthcare (CATCH) training. Through an application and grading process, the program of teaching nutrition and physical activity met the criteria regarding best practices and was awarded the Silver Level Award and received \$150 from the Piedmont Health Foundation. Ann Cunningham commended Justin Miller, Clara O'Neal and India Jackson on the excellent job of making healthy nutrition and physical activity changes and improvements for our program, children and community.
- g) City Auditorium Celebration 11/3/16 The opening for the Arts Celebration is scheduled for November 3 at the Center for the Arts, 100 Davis Avenue. Attendees will have the opportunity to meet the artists in residence and view their artwork as well as touring the facility. Jim Quick and Coastline will

provide the entertainment in the park on the mobile stage and the Needmore After School program participants will perform on the auditorium stage at intermission. Food trucks will be available for the public. Marc Metcalf inquired what medium was used to advertise this event. Ann informed the board social media, email, the department's website, local newspapers and Greer Today was utilized.

- h) 2016/2017 Upcoming Events a listing of the upcoming events was given to each trustee (copy attached).
- i) 2016/2017 Highlighted Projects a listing of the ongoing department projects was given to each trustee (copy attached).

XI. Old Business

a) Nomination of Adhoc Representative – DAV Adhoc Representative, Paul Shanks, nomination was not approved as there was not a quorum. The nomination will be placed on the January 10, 2017 meeting agenda.

- Youth basketball registrations were completed with practices every Tuesday and Thursday at the Victor Gym. This is the first year of our youth basketball program. Participants ranging from age 6 – 12 will compete with other municipalities from the area in competitive league play.
- Robin Byouk, Cory Holtzclaw and Olivia Swalm, Greer Middle College Charter High School intern, attended the Crestview Elementary Family Night on November 14. The City of Greer Parks and Recreation Department's information table was host to several hundred students and their families.
- The Giving Thanks Student Art Show entries were judged and hung in the art gallery at Greer City Hall. The

 friends and community members in attendance.

 - Two line dancing classes were held on November 9 and 30 at the Tryon Recreation Center with 8 seniors in attendance at each session.
