## **Athletics – Cory Holtzclaw, Athletic Supervisor**

#### Tennis & Golf Committee - Red Watson, Assistant Director

o There are no issues reported to the tennis or golf committees. We will be scheduling an Adhoc committee meeting shortly to discuss fees and policy changes.

#### Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC) – Sara Odom, Cultural Arts Coordinator

- The Greer Children's Theatre held six (6) performances of Frozen Jr. at the Cannon Center. All the shows on the second weekend were sold out.
- Finding Nemo Jr. auditions were held on November 13, 14, and 16. Forty-two (42) children were cast and thirty-eight (38) have accepted their roles. Rehearsals are being held at both Tryon Recreation Center and the Center for the Arts.

## SOAR (Seniors Out and Around) / Tennis & Pickleball - Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- Our seniors just returned from a trip to Hendersonville today, which included lunch at Haus Heidelberg and a visit to Grandad's Apples. There are no issues or concerns at this time.
- Tennis & Pickleball Blue Ridge and Wade Hampton H.S. rented our courts for a fundraiser during their respective Spirit Weeks. PRT hosted the Round Robin Rumble Pickleball tournament October 18-22, at Tryon Recreation Center, benefiting our Adaptive Pickleball program. No issues or concerns to report.

#### **Departmental Updates**

Athletics Division – Cory Holtzclaw, Athletics Supervisor

#### **Greer PRT Tackle Football**

- Greer PRT Tackle Football postseason tournaments concluded, and for the second year in a row, Greer played for a state championship. Greer competed against Mount Pleasant at West Florence High School in the title game and unfortunately came up short. Most of these boys will now move on to play for their middle school teams next season after back-to-back state title runs. We wish them well in their future athletic endeavors.
- Between all 3 forms of football we offer; 11 men, 8 men, and 7 v 7 passing league, nearly 300 participants are now learning the sport which was our goal when we first ventured into this divisional breakup.

#### **Greer Christmas 7s Rugby Tournament**

• The Greer Christmas 7s Rugby Tournament concluded on Sunday, December 10th. High School Girls and Boys Rugby programs from all over the eastern seaboard traveled to Greer to compete in this invitational tournament. Teams typically arrive on Friday, December 8th and then over the next 2-days compete in 6 different matches. This past tournament the rain started on Friday night and did not stop until the following Monday. The athletic staff,

officials and trainers worked through the bad weather conditions and we got every single match in. The Raleigh Redhawks won the girl's division, Pendleton Indiana Rugby won the Boy's Gold Division, and Rebels Rugby from Marietta Georgia won the Boy's Silver Division.

• The total economic impact of this tournament was \$90,310.00.

#### **Greer PRT Youth Basketball**

- Youth basketball registration filled up within 9 days of registration notice. At one point close to 85 kids were on the waiting list. This season, Greer PRT athletics staff reached an agreement to rent additional gym space from New Jerusalem Baptist Church to accommodate youth basketball teams. I want to thank Pastor Watson and New Jerusalem Baptist Church for partnering with us for the 2nd straight year. If you combine the total number of participants with waiting list numbers it would have been possible this season to have 300 plus kids playing youth basketball in Greer. That would make basketball the 2nd largest sport by season next to baseball and followed by soccer.
- League seasons started January 4th at Victor Gym. Each league night roughly 240 spectators and 60 participants compete at Victor. Per week, just with our youth basketball league right at 1500 people are on site.

#### Greer 76ers Junior and High School Rugby

- Our high school rugby program competed in two (2) preseason 7s tournaments. One in Atlanta, Georgia, and one in Greer, SC. Right now our high school kids are preparing for their next step which is the Rugby South Carolina Season. During this season they will travel to every part of the state for Jamborees. Greer is set to host our next Jamboree on January 27.
- 2024 marked a first for our rugby program by introducing junior tackles. This program is designed for 9-10-year-old kids wanting to learn the tackle version of the sport. In past years we hosted summer flag versions. They had their first match in Atlanta, GA in 30-degree weather and pouring rain.
- Rugby continues to be a very small number sport in our community and the upstate of South Carolina, but it is the most diverse group we have. Players from Clemson, Easley, Simpsonville, Anderson, and all over the upstate head to Greer 2-3 nights a week to train.

#### **Tomahawk Youth Wrestling Club**

• Tomahawk Youth Wrestling is full once again this season. We have 24 first-time wrestlers, a record for our program. Wrestlers will begin competing in statewide tournaments on January 20th. Our second annual Tomahawk Invitational Tournament will be held at Greer High School on February 10th with an anticipation of 140 wrestlers competing in the tournament.

#### **Cheer For Greer**

• Cheer for Greer completed their season in December after taking part in the pregame show at the ACC Championship game in Charlotte. The Cheer for Greer program reached maximum capacity again this past season.

#### **Foothills Soccer Club of Green**

 Foothills Soccer Club of Greer Academy's fall season will conclude on January 13th when the U17 team competes for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association State Cup championship. The match was postponed to December due to the weather. The spring season will begin on January 15 and will be completed in early May. Essentially, soccer never stops.

#### Cultural Arts Division – Sara Odom, Cultural Arts Coordinator

- The Center for the Arts hosted a delegation from the City of Newberry on November 9. The Parks, Recreation & Tourism staff hosted a presentation about our facilities and conducted a tour of the Center for the Arts and then the delegation went on to tour other City facilities.
- Robin Byouk and the Ceramics Instructor, Martha Grattan traveled to Newberry in December to consult with the staff on their new arts center plans and tour the facility.
- Four (4) of our Artists-in-Residence participated in Greenville Open Studios on November 11 & 12.
- During November both the Wall Gallery at City Hall and the Center for the Arts displayed the artwork from our in-resident artists, and is currently on display at City Hall.
- The Cultural Arts Division programmed the entertainment for the Tree Lighting Ceremony. Because of the rain, half of the performers canceled. But the carolers went up on the stage and the ice sculptor was a big hit.
- The Holiday Arts Fair was held on December 9. We had over 20 vendors and over 200 people in attendance.
- The Gary Huntoon Memorial Empty Bowls project was held during the Holiday Arts Fair on December 9. Over \$3000 was raised for the Recreation Division to be used for food, snacks, and art events.
- The Student Art Show, *Through the Eyes of a Child*, was hung in the Art Gallery in December. Over 140 people attended the Art Reception on December 5.
- The Annual Gingerbread House Display was held at the Center for the Arts for the first two weeks in December with over 200 people visiting.
- The current exhibition at the Center for the Arts is the Created by Black Artist Exhibition which will be on display through the end of February.

- The Greer Farmers Market Fall Fest and Chili Cook-off took place on Tuesday, November 7. With over 12 different vendors competing in the Chili Cook-off, guests had the opportunity to purchase samples and vote for their favorite chili. Additionally, more than 35 vendors were onsite, offering a variety of goods and food. It was an overall great time for all in attendance.
- Despite heavy rains, the Greer Christmas Tree Lighting took place on Friday, December 1, with over 2,000 people in attendance. Mayor Danner and Santa helped celebrate the lighting of the Greer Christmas tree with live musical performances, 5 free craft stations, Christmas train rides, marshmallow roasting, and an ice carving demonstration.
- Supper with Santa took place on Friday, December 1, with a record-breaking 308 City of Greer employees and their families in attendance. Guests had the opportunity to take pictures with Santa and enjoy free kids' crafts. This event raised over \$1,850, which was donated to the City of Greer Police Department's Cops for Tots. The Cops for Tots event occurred on Saturday, December 16, at the City of Greer Event Halls.
- Breakfast with Santa took place on Saturday, December 2, with a sold-out crowd of 500 people. The breakfast, provided by Laurenda's Family Restaurant, was accompanied by various activities, including free crafts, Letter to Santa stations, a live musical performance by His and Her, and an opportunity for children to see and talk with Santa.
- The Greer Farmers Market Christmas Festival took place on Saturday, December 3, and Sunday, December 4. With over 80 vendors, guests had the opportunity to purchase gifts and items for the Christmas season. The two-day event saw over 3,000 people in attendance.
- The first Greer Farmers Market Sunday Brunch Market took place on Sunday, January 14, at Greer City Park. This event has continued to increase in popularity, featuring over 35 local artisans, food trucks, free yoga, and live music by TC Costello. The Sunday Brunch Markets will continue once a month through April, with the regularly scheduled Tuesday markets starting on May 7.

#### **Ambassadors**

The Greer Station Shuttles continued to support our local restaurants, shops, and businesses in downtown Greer Station by picking up over 9,773 people throughout the year.

<u>Greer Golf</u> – Sam Merrell, Assistant General Manager, Greer Golf

- Staff evaluated and made recommendations for a new golf cart fleet that will be delivered in December of this year.
- Our Grounds Maintenance staff over-seeded select tee boxes with winter rye grass throughout the course. This will help to protect our warm-season grass during its winter dormancy.
- We are now operating out of the "Cabana", or the old "Pool House", while construction takes place in the clubhouse.

- Staff has been working on producing new pricing recommendations for golf and the driving range. We will also work with the Events Division to establish policies and fees for our rental amenities after construction.
- We recommend advertising an RFP for restaurant services to bring a restaurant vendor. Finance currently has the document and we hope the advertisement goes out this month
- We recorded just under \$600k in revenue in the first 6 months of this Fiscal Year, which is over \$100k more than the same period last year.

#### **Upcoming Events**

- We are partnering with the Greenville County Golf Association to host multiple competitive tournaments this year, attracting top golfers from across the state to play on our course.
- We will host a robust slate of private outings/tournaments, group leagues, and events throughout the year.
- In partnership with the 1st Tee and Grow Golf, we will offer structured group classes and lessons.
- We will be hosting both boys' and girls' golf teams, again this year, from local high schools in the spring and fall.

## **Recreation Division** – Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- Our Recreation Centers are successfully implementing Division Programming for seniors, afterschool programs, clubs, civic groups, community programs, and events.
- The Recreation Department Final Numbers for 2023
  - o Recreation Center Rentals 124
  - o Kids Planet Shelter Rentals 846
  - Pickleball Programming 1,366 63% (863ppl) took our Introductory/Beginner Class
- The MLK Jr. Celebration Luncheon took place on Monday, January 23 at the Event Halls located inside Greer City Hall. The event featured performances by the Saint Mark Vessels of Praise Choir and the James Brothers, along with a keynote speech by State Representative Wendell Jones. Peggy's Diner provided the catering for the event, which was sold out with tickets priced at \$10.00 each. The RB Sullivan Sr. Legacy Award went to Pastor Steve Watson. The Samaritan Awards went to Eric Burnside, Marshall, and Leon James (James brothers).

#### **Tourism Division** – Lindsey Shaffer, Tourism Specialist

- Fourteen approved Special Event Permit Applications and two filming permits.
- For *Discover Greer*, we had 9,765 website visits, over 800 visitor guide views, and 20,000+ followers on social media.
- We received approximately \$13,000.00 in grant funding for tourism marketing for the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

- The Tourism Division hosted Live Window Displays during the Tree Lighting Ceremony on Friday, December 1 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. as a means to encourage people to visit downtown while they waited for Santa to arrive at Greer City Park. Four stores participated and we received good feedback from people who viewed the displays. We hope to continue the event next year and have more stores participate.
- One of our upcoming projects includes updating the Downtown Historic Walking Tour in partnership with the Greer Heritage Museum. The tour will be available in a print/digital format and ultimately will be made into an interactive online experience as we work with our GIS Department.

**Grounds Maintenance - Urban Parks Division** – Red Watson, Assistant Director of Parks, Recreation and Tourism *on behalf of Public Services*.

#### Veterans Park:

- The areas around the Monument received new, seasonal flower installs by Felicity's Flowers.
- New gloss-black benches were installed throughout the park. 8 benches were installed.
- The bollards and chains surrounding the front section of the monument, and the gate between the walls were also sprayed with a new coat of gloss black by staff to repair scratches and weather-worn marks.
- Staff installed 14 new banners from the acorn light poles in replacement of old, worn-out banners

#### Needmore Center::

- ADA parking spaces and curb lines were repainted by staff where this had faded from the weather elements
  - Staff removed 6 overgrown holly trees from the front left side of the building. New landscaping in this area is planned for the spring.

#### Center for the Arts:

• Staff installed 18 new banners at the park. Center for the Arts did not have banners on the poles and these were added to match many of the other City facilities.

#### City Park:

• Staff installed a new aerator motor in the City Park pond to replace the existing aerator motor that had blown out

#### <u>Grounds Maintenance – Athletics:</u>

#### Country Club Road Park:

• Staff Painted the Greer "G" in red white and blue and also the Family Dental logos for the Rugby tournament that was held at Country Club on Fields 1 and 2 in December and for the upcoming games in January and February

#### In-House Turf Management Program:

• Staff continued with the In-House Turf Program with all over-seeded athletics fields which are City Stadium, Country Club Fields 1 and 2, and Suber Soccer Fields 1 and 2

#### General:

- "Staff members are currently performing winter pruning across the entire park system.
- Mason McCravy was promoted to Urban Parks Grounds Supervisor. Will specifically oversee City Park, Center for the Arts, and the Downtown Urban Park.
- Installed and removed all of the Christmas decorations throughout the City of Greer, Center for the Arts, and City Park.
- Fourteen staff members assisted with the Christmas tree lighting, totaling 63 hours of work.
- Staff assist with the Christmas Parade using 28 employees at 187 hours
- Rain total Since the last meeting, we have received 9.93 inches of rain as of January 16, 2023

## Greer Golf Financial Reports - Red Watson, Assistant Director - Parks, Recreation and Tourism

- Program Funds We have started the fiscal year off strong with fall program registration and revenue and expect another good year.
- We anticipate the completion of the improvements for PARD Funds (Golf Course Practice Green) by the end of November. These upgrades will feature a containment area for the ball dispensing machine and dumpster, a synthetic turf hitting area on the tee box, and new signage.

#### Director's Report - Ann Cunningham, Director

#### **Staff Recognition**

The South Carolina Recreation and Parks Association's Programming Branch created a new award category this year: "Programmer of the Year". The recipient of this award must have done impactful & meaningful work in the community and deserve this recognition amongst their peers.

Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor, meets all of the criteria outlined and required to receive this award.

Congratulations to Justin for receiving this first-ever award by SCRPA's Programming Branch for "Programmer of the Year"!

The next award that I would like to mention on behalf of the South Carolina Recreation and Parks Association is for the "Professional of the Year Award." This is the most prestigious award that is given to an individual from SCRPA.

There was a clear winner this year and the recipient of this award was Red Watson, Assistant Director. To quote Jim Headley, Executive Director with SCRPA, "While you all see Red from the Greer side of things, we get to see him from a statewide perspective. Be assured that Red is loved, trusted, and respected just as much across the state and in our profession as he is at home in Greer."

Red was given this award at the SCRPA Annual Awards Banquet during our joint state conference in Wilmington, NC, on Wednesday, December 10. His wife Amy and their two boys, Cash and Whit were present when Red received this award.

#### **Current/Ongoing Projects**

#### **Wards Creek Trail System**

- The SCDOT LPA (Local Public Agency (LPA) Qualifications Evaluation Form for applying for the City of Greer to be an LPA for the administration of Ward's Creek Greenway Trail Phase 1 is under final review with Keck + Wood, our consulting firm. Once it is complete, we will send a draft to SCDOT for their review and consideration.
- This phase extends from Biblebrook Drive to Wards Creek Park. The length is approximately .45 miles. The total amount we are requesting from SCDOT is \$1,090,345.60. The City of Greer's local match is \$272,586.40. That is 20% of the total estimated project cost of \$1,362,932.00.

## **South Tyger River Greenway**

- Keck + Wood has received approval from the Plan Review process with the City of Greer. The City has signed the maintenance agreement for SCDOT. We have attempted to keep communication with SCDOT ongoing to determine what our next steps will be, but anticipate very few additional requirements from this point forward.
- We have obtained easement approvals from both properties associated with the trail that are not owned by the City of Greer (Greenville School District and Cypress Landing HOA).
- Two new nature trails are nearing completion at Country Club Road Park that will connect with the South Tyger River Greenway. There is one trail that is for strolling and is ADA compliant and then there is a more rugged trail that is narrow and very little of the natural rock, tree roots, and plants have been disturbed. Signage for the trail is being determined and will complement the South Tyger River Greenway signage.

#### Victor Park

- The City is earnestly taking the necessary steps to acquire land and planning for a new recreational sports facility.
- We plan to vacate Victor Gym in late spring and the ball field in early summer. The ball field will be reconstructed at Turner Park. Many of our programs will be moved to other facilities.

#### **Turner Ball Park**

• The City has selected a contractor and awarded the project to Sexton Design and Development, and the contract has been signed by both parties. We will be meeting on-site with the contractor very soon to plan the construction process moving forward.

#### **Greer Golf - Clubhouse and Pool Area Renovation**

#### **Current/Ongoing Projects**

#### **Wards Creek Trail System**

• With the help of City of Greer staff, Keck + Wood is continuing to compile information for the LPA (Local Public Agency) Qualifications Evaluation Form. Once all information is gathered, we will send a draft to SCDOT for their review.

#### **South Tyger River Greenway**

• Two new nature trails are nearing completion at Country Club Road Park that will connect with the South Tyger River Greenway. One trail is for strolling and is ADA compliant while the other trail is more rugged, narrow, and natural. Signage for the trails are being determined and will complement the South Tyger River Greenway signage.

#### **Victor Park**

- The City is earnestly taking the necessary steps to acquire land in preparation for a new recreational sports facility.
- Greer PRT and programs will tentatively be vacating Victor Gym in late spring and Victor ball field in early summer. The ball field will be reconstructed at Turner Park. Many of our programs will be moved to other facilities.

#### **Turner Ball Park**

• This project was put out for bid on October 6, 2023, and awarded to Sexton Design and Development. It is our understanding the contractor has returned the construction contract to the City with some changes and is currently being reviewed by the City. 
- Events staff are planning and finalizing details for our upcoming spring events.

#### **Current/Ongoing Projects**

#### **Wards Creek Trail System**

Keck + Wood received the remaining information needed for the LPA Evaluation Application from the
City on Friday, February 9. After assisting the City with submitting the first application to SCDOT, they
provided some comments. These issues have been addressed and the revised form was returned to
the City of Greer on February 19. Our consultants are waiting for SCDOT to complete their second
review of the application and will continue to assist the City in this process.

#### **South Tyger River Greenway**

Keck + Wood submitted the requested maintenance agreements and letters to SCDOT on January 30.
 We have received confirmation of receipt and staff with SCDOT will review it. We anticipate the issuing of the encroachment permit in the near future. Keck + Wood has provided a cost estimate for Phase 1 of the Greenway and will continue to work with the City on phasing for this project.

#### **Victor Park**

- The City is earnestly taking the necessary steps to acquire land in preparation for a new recreational sports facility.
- Greer PRT will tentatively be vacating Victor Gym and Victor ball field in early summer. The ball field will be reconstructed at Turner Park. Many of our programs will be moved to other facilities.

#### **Turner Ball Park**

- A pre-construction meeting was held on February 19. 



- Athletics Coordinator, Phil Hembree, met with local municipal athletic supervisors to create a new baseball and softball tournament called the "MB6 Upstate All Star Tournament" which will be held in the upstate from May 27 through Saturday June 1.
- Greer PRT athletics division was awarded the Division 1 and Division 2 South Carolina District Tournament, this event is set to be hosted at Century Park Thursday, June 13 through Thursday, June 20.


#### **Cultural Arts**

- The 2024 Juried Art Show reception was held on Tuesday March 19. We had 29 people attend.
- Clay Classes continue five days a week including Saturday. Our new instructor starts next week which will give us a third instructor. Most of our classes have a waiting list.
- Robin Byouk attended the 2024 South & Appalachia Creative Placemaking Summit in Atlanta Georgia March 6-8.
- The Recreation and Arts Division hosted Junior Leadership Greer at the Center for the Arts on Tuesday, March 12. We presented for the City of Greer Departments and painted butterflies with the participants.
- Staff hosted several rental tours.
- The Foothills Philharmonic Woodwind Quartet preformed at the Center for the Arts on March 16, with 67 people in attendance.
- A Free Open House Zumba class was held on Tuesday, March 12.
- The directorial team for the GCT fall production of the Wizard of Oz met on Monday, March 18.
- Staff and GCAC volunteers helped with Face painting at the Eggtastic event on Saturday, March 23.

#### **Events**

- The Greer Farmers Market Sunday Brunch took place on Sunday, March 10 with a St. Patrick's Day theme. This included food trucks serving Irish food, Celtic music, and also included a visit from Merida from the Disney movie Brave. The market had over 40 vendors and the best attendance of all the Sunday Brunch Markets.
- We are currently planning and finalizing details for our upcoming spring events such as Food Truck Rollout on April 12, International Festival on April 20, and Moonlight Movies starting June 6.
- The first Food Truck Rollout of 2024 occurred on Friday, March 15, with an estimated 300 attendees. The event featured five food trucks, with Greer Relief providing beer and wine, and live music by Away Team. Due to wet grass, the band was moved inside. However, attendees enjoyed both inside and outside areas, making the event a success. Additionally, the City of Greer Communications Department set up a booth to provide information regarding recycling and litter pickup, while the Leadership Greer class was raising awareness for their project.
- The Events Division has blocked off the Cannon Centre for scheduled painting during the week of March 25-29.

The Events Division hosted 54 total events – Internal: 34, Rentals: 14, Special Events: 3, Wedding Events: 3. A total of 6,000 guests visited the City of Greer Events Center. The Ambassadors have continued to provide excellent customer service to 650 passengers in downtown Greer Station in the month of March.
