

Century Park Pedestrian Bridge Installation

The City of Greer Parks and Recreation Department is committed to fulfilling our mission of providing quality recreational experiences while administering the values of community image, human development, preservation of environmental resources, health and wellness, economic development and cultural unity.

Department Projects

- On January 11, Century Park Pedestrian Bridge was installed by Capitol Construction of the Carolinas, LLC, Spartanburg, SC.
- On January 23, Ann Cunningham and Red Watson met with SGA Architecture at their Greenville office regarding updates for the Center for the Arts renovation project.
- Notification was received from the Land and Water Conservation Fund that the Letter of Intent for the grant was accepted. Red Watson will attend a grant workshop in February and the grant application will be due on March 30. This grant would be utilized to provide outside restrooms at H.R. Turner Park and Victor Park.

Department Trainings

- Robin Byouk attended the Junior Theatre Festival in Atlanta, Ga on January 12-14.
- On January 16, Parks and Recreation Department staff attended Civic Rec software webinar training for facility reservations.
- Robin Byouk and Justin Miller attended the South Carolina Festival and Event Association Conference, in Hilton Head, SC, on January 21-23.
- Red Watson attended a grant workshop for the Recreational Trails Program at the Cayce Tennis Center in Cayce, SC on January 24.
- Robin Byouk and Ashlyn Stone attended Ten at the Top "Culture Counts" Forum in Spartanburg, SC, on January 24.
- Grounds Maintenance Division staff attended a Landscape Maintenance Workshop at Spartanburg Community College, Spartanburg, SC on January 30.

Department Participation

- Robin Byouk attended the Junior Theatre Festival, in Atlanta, GA on January 12-14.
- The first quarter Greer Recreation Association Board meeting was held, on January 25, at City Hall. Ann Cunningham introduced new trustees, John Bohannon (District 1) and Pamela Taylor (District 5) to the board.
- Department staff attended the City of Greer's Safety Celebration Luncheon at the Cannon Centre on January
 26. The luncheon celebrated over 400 days without a lost time accident.

Department Highlights

- The 16th Annual MLK Day of Celebration Luncheon was held on Monday, January 15. Once again, this event was sold out this year. Patrons were treated to entertainment from The Taylor Family and Gary Sherman Jr. A catered lunch from the South House in Greer, SC was provided and Rev. Curtis Johnson was the keynote speaker for the second year in a row.
- Ann Cunningham presented the Recreation Department's Annual Report to Greer City Council on January 23. Included this year was a short video that highlighted some of the department's programs throughout the year. Plans are being made to use this video, through social media and other avenues, to advertise the Parks and Recreation Department and its programs and events. The department's annual inspection with Ed Driggers was held on January 30. Mike Sell performed an inspection of the department's vehicles.
- The Grounds Maintenance Division:
 - Drained and cleaned the pond at Greer City Park and repaired the diffuser compressor.
 - Removed Christmas decorations from the downtown area, Greer City Park and roadside power poles.
 - Assisted Greer CPW with planting 14 trees at Century Park Disc Golf in conjunction with Arbor Day.
 - Installed maintenance area windscreens at County Club Road Park.
 - Cleared sidewalks of snow at Greer City Park, Cannon Centre, Police and Courts, Fire Department and all recreation facilities.
 - Pruned shrubs at Greer City Stadium and the gazebo area of Victor Memorial Veterans Park.
 - Staff assisted with the installation of the Pedestrian Bridge at Century Park.
 - Repaired pipe break on the irrigation pump at Greer City Park and constructed an insulated cover on the pump to prevent freezing.
 - Removed graffiti from the block wall at the Needmore Recreation Center and the play structure at Victor Heights Community Park.
 - Contracted WP Law to repair pipe leak on the lower fountain at Greer City Park.
 - Prepared Greer City Stadium for the FSCG Academy Soccer season.
- Academy soccer was facilitated at South Suber Road Park and City Stadium. FSCG Academy teams compete
 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at these facilities as well as various facilities throughout the state
 and southeast. The first spring game for these teams was held on January 27 at Greer City Stadium. The
 season will be completed with State Cup tournaments in May.
- Youth basketball league activities were facilitated at Victor Gym and Mauldin Sports Center. The Mauldin and City of Greer Parks and Recreation Department's teams competed with each other during the winter season. Currently seven teams, consisting of three (8U), two (10U) and two (12U), practice and scrimmage on Monday Friday nights. This is the second season, in recent years, offering the youth basketball program; last season had three teams (one in each age division). Regular season will conclude in January and post-season tournaments will take place in February. Greer Parks and Recreation will sponsor two all-star teams for the first time in the history of the department's program.
- Youth wrestling practices were facilitated at Riverside High School on Tuesday and Thursday nights. Wrestlers competed in a duals match at Victor Gym on January 20. Wrestling teams from Mauldin, Dorman, Byrnes and other local areas came to compete in a team format. Duals events are very popular among local wrestling clubs.
- Spring sports registration began on January 2 for city residents and January 8 for non-residents. The spring season includes youth baseball (Greer Baseball Club), girls' softball and youth soccer (Foothills Soccer Club of Greer). Regular registration ends on February 2 without a late fee and late registration ends on February 9.

- The Recreation Division continued to facilitate the following programs:

 - Creative Advancement After School Program Victor Gym (280 participants monthly)
 - Needmore After School Program Needmore Recreation Center (100 participants monthly)
- S.O.A.R. (Seniors Out and ARound):
 - Line Dancing Classes were held on January 3, 11 and 23 with an average attendance of 20 seniors.
 - Bingo was held on January 4 with 15 members in attendance.
 - On January 8, a meeting was held to determine the amount of interest in starting a Whole Fitness Senior Class. The topic was "How to get fit in the New Year" and seven seniors attended.
 - Ten SOAR members traveled to Eden Terrace in Spartanburg for a fun tour of the facility and enjoyed sweet treats.
 - The SOAR monthly Potluck Luncheon was held on January 16 with a special guest speaker, Kelly Keesling, from Wren Hospice. Kelly presented information regarding the services they offer to 18 seniors.
 - A Movie Day was held on January 22 where 10 seniors enjoyed the romantic comedy "Home Again".
 - On January 26, the Lunch Bunch took a trip to the Café at Williams Hardware in Travelers Rest.
 Twenty-eight members attended this fun excursion.
 - The average attendance for the month was 15.
- Robin Byouk taught art classes at the Tryon Recreation Center every Tuesday with approximately 8-10 students each week.
- Cultural Arts dance classes began on Wednesdays at the Tryon Recreation Center with approximately 18 students each week.
- The Events Division hosted 29 events at which 1,710 guests visited the City of Greer Events Center.
- The first Food Truck Rollout of 2018 was held on January 19 at Greer City Park. Six food trucks served over 25 guests as they stood around fire pits enjoying the park and live entertainment by Vilai Harrington.
- The Events Division is in the process of planning for the following event:



Area Assignments

<u>Area 1</u>

During the month of January, there were 541 calls for service in Area 1 compared to 523 calls for service in December (3.44% increase). Area 1 officers had 355 proactive calls, which included 129 traffic stops. In February, officers will continue to concentrate in the hot spot areas of Target and QT. A project will be started to have Area 1 officers working with LP officers from retail stores on US 29 to increase communication amongst themselves as well as the police department. During CompStat, it was learned there have been recent traffic complaints in the O'Neal Rd. area that will also be addressed by Area 1 officers. During the month of January, Sgt. Sharratta went to each convenience store in the area and spoke with them about any concerns or issues they have recently had.

- Target Plaza: Upon reviewing the criminal calls for service (CFS) at this location, there was a 69% decrease in calls received when comparing December 2017 to January 2018. This location still appears to be a primary area of concern for officers in Area 1. During the month of January, there were 9 CFS at this shopping plaza. Six of the calls were for shoplifting, 1 for an autobreaking, and 1 was for a dispute. Area 1 officers conducted 36 extra patrols in this area to help alleviate some of the CFS.
- Needmore Community: The criminal calls for service held steady when comparing December 2017 to January 2018. Each of these months had 12 criminal calls for service. In January 2018, five of these CFS were for disturbances. Area 1 officers will continue to conduct extra patrols in the Needmore Community. Sgt. Sharratta spoke with Sylvia Jones concerning an issue with someone in the area burning items in a metal drum in their yard.

Area 2

- Walmart Project: This location continues to be the most predominant location in Area 2 for calls for service. In January, there were 95 calls for service at Walmart, 66 of which were proactive in nature. There were 7 arrests made at Walmart in January. Area 2 officers continue to focus their efforts on this location in an effort to deter criminal activity. Sgt. Ferrell met with the AP manager, Ashley Roberson, and discussed the shoplifting issues with her. Roberson stated she has seen a much quicker response time to requests for police and this is most likely due to the Area 2 officers conducting their extra patrols. Some of the more significant calls for service at Walmart included a stolen vehicle from Murphy USA that was left running at the gas pumps, a subject stole a cash register from the store and was arrested shortly thereafter, and an employee who was found to have stolen approximately \$3700 in merchandise.
- Northgate Apartments: This apartment complex has once again garnered the attention of Area 2 officers. This location had an emphasis placed on it in September 2017 after numerous drug arrests were made. During the month of January, there was a shooting that occurred at Apt. 25 and area 2 officers have renewed their efforts to focus on known drug users that frequent this location. There have been several drug users that have been identified at this location and efforts are being made with the Greer Housing Authority to look at possible lease violations with the tenants of this apartment.
- Prolific Offender Targeting: Officer Prino has started to dedicate a portion of his workday to track down and arrest subjects with outstanding warrants for violent crimes and known prolific offenders. One such subject that Officer Prino arrested this month was David Fisher who was

wanted for DV 1st. Officer Prino has met with the Victim's Advocate to develop a list subjects that have outstanding DV warrants. This will help make more timely arrests of individuals wanted for DV and help ensure the safety of the victims in these cases.

Area 3

During the month of January, there were 601 total calls for service in Area 3 compared to 822 calls for service in December (27% reduction). Also during January, Area 3 officers had 359 proactive calls with 128 of those being traffic stops and 69 extra patrols. It was noted there were 8 larceny reports taken in January compared to 5 in December, however when compared to January 2017, there were 3 fewer reports taken. There were 3 burglaries reported in January compared to 5 in December 2017. Sgt. Eldridge is in the early stages of looking into the development of an Android/iPhone App. This app. would have the ability to link our agency with community members in a variety of ways and allow our area sergeants the ability to post real time issues specific to their areas in a timely manner.

- **Greer Mill:** There were 35 calls for service in the Greer Mill area during January compared to 18 in December, 14 of which were proactive in nature. Two arrests were made in the Greer Mill Area in January (FTC and CSC).
- Apartment Complexes:
 - O **Preserve at Westview:** During January, there were 2 calls for service at this location compared to 6 calls the previous month with no incident reports taken.
 - O **Legacy Crescent Apartments:** During January, there were 22 calls for service compared to 7 calls the previous month of which 15 were proactive in nature by area officers. Five incident reports were taken including one for a stolen vehicle that was left running in the parking lot.

Area 4

- **Prolific Offenders:** Officers located Anthony Goudelock who was wanted for Attempted Murder with this agency while he was working at Synchreon. Bryan McGee was located at a residence on Dobson Shed Rd and taken into custody for 5 active warrants with this agency. 




CID Cases Cleared


The chart represents the overall total number of cases CID closed in the month of January. These cases may have been previously assigned or assigned this month.


The second half of 2017 indicated an average of 52.5 new cases assigned per month.

Vice/CID assisted Greenville County Sheriff's Office, Homeland Security and the state Attorney General's Office with Operation Homefront beginning January 31st. It was the first of two 3-day operations targeting child predator offenders. Both men and women were also arrested and charged with adult prostitution related offenses. Overall, **5** females were arrested for prostitution, **4** males were arrested for prostitution, drug, and weapons violations, and **3** males were arrested for charges related to attempted criminal sexual conduct with a minor. Furthermore, sufficient evidence was obtained to criminally charge an additional **10** males with sex crimes relating to children.

Consideration paid or to be paid in money's worth includes, but is not limited to, other realty, personal property, stocks, bonds, partnership interest and other intangible property, the forgiveness or carcellation of a debt, the assumption of a debt, and the surrendering of any right. The fair market value of the consideration must be used in calculating the consideration paid in money's worth. Taxpayers may elect to use the fair market value of the realty being transferred in determining fair market value of the consideration. In the case of realty transferred between a corporation, a partnership, or other entity and a stockholder, partner, or owner of the entity, and in the case of realty transferred to a trust or as a distribution to a trust beneficiary, "value" means the realty's fair market value. A deduction from value is allowed for the amount of any lien or encumbrance existing on the land, tenement, or realty before the transfer and remaining on the land, tenement, or realty tax purposes in determining fair market value under the provisions of the law.

Exempted from the fee are deeds:

- (1) transferring realty in which the value of the realty, as Section 12-24-30, is equal to or less than one hundred dollars; as defined in Code

Sec. 18-483. - Location.

Because of potentially objectionable operational characteristics of the above uses, and the potential deleterious affect of such uses on existing businesses and/or residential areas around them, the location of such uses shall be governed as follows:.

A license must not be issued to a tattoo facility, if the place of business is within 1,000 feet of a church, school (public or private), playground or recreational facility, residentially-zoned lot, public park, day care facility or an establishment which serves alcoholic beverages. This distance must be computed by following a straight line of the nearest property line of the church, school (public or private), playground or recreational facility, residentially zoned lot, public park, day care facility, or an establishment which serves alcoholic beverages.

As used in this subsection:

- (1) "Church" means an establishment, other than a private dwelling, where religious services are usually conducted.
- (2) "School" means an establishment, other than a private dwelling where the usual processes of education are usually conducted.
- (3) "Playground" means a place, other than grounds at a private dwelling that is provided by the public or members of a community for recreation.

A tattoo facility shall be located only in areas zoned industrial district (I-1) or service district (S-1) and will be issued a use permitted by special exception subject to this article.

The City contracted with engineering consultant Cotransco for project design, specifications, bidding assistance and inspections. Cotransco is also the engineering consultant for the streetscape project.

The project consists of milling and repaving public alleys and parking lots, re-striping, curb repair and additional lighting as necessary.

Bids were opened on February 22, 2018. Cotransco received 2 bids. Bids were as follows:

- Earth Materials Grading Inc., Anderson, SC \$464,830.90
- S&S Construction, Anderson, SC \$470,281.55

Cost estimates indicated project should cost approximately \$447,728.

Cotransco is familiar with this contractor and is satisfied they can complete this project.

Staff recommends the project be awarded to Earth Materials Grading, Inc. in the amount of \$464,830.90. Staff recommends 10% contingency for a total budget of \$511,313.99
