I. Call to Order

Wayne Yount (Chairman) called to order the regular meeting of the Greer Recreation Association Board at 6:17pm on January 24, 2019 at Greer City Hall, Hall A.

The following members of the Board of Trustees attended:

Others Present: Ann Cunningham (Director), Red Watson (Assistant Director), Robbie Davis (Events Supervisor), Justin Miller (Recreation Supervisor), Travis Durham (Grounds Maintenance Superintendent), Cory Holtzclaw (Athletic Supervisor), Robin Byouk (Cultural Arts Supervisor), Sally Wise (Administrative Assistant), and Bob and Mary Reimer (SOAR Adhoc Representatives).

Introduction of Trustees – Ann Cunningham, Director

Travis Ware was reappointed for a second term in District 2.

Wayne Yount was reappointed for a third term in District 4

Jason Bridwell was appointed by Councilwoman Judy Albert in District 6. Jason has served 5 years on the Greer Baseball Club Board.

VI. Committee Reports

a) **Cheerleading** – Cory Holtzclaw, Athletic Supervisor

- Marie Paris, Adhoc Representative and Cheerleading Coach requested the cheerleaders cheer for some of the basketball games at Victor Gym. The participants had a great time.

b) **Cultural Arts** – Robin Byouk – Cultural Arts Supervisor

- Greer Children's Theatre performed the full length version, Annie, at the J Harley Bonds Career Center on November 9-11 and November 16-18, 2018. Fox Carolina broadcast their early morning news report from the J. Harley Bonds Center with the Annie cast on opening day.
- Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC) sponsored the "Lest We Forget" Veterans Musical Tribute by the Upstate Men's Choir at the Cannon Center on November 11, 2018.
- Auditions and rehearsals for the Lion King Jr were held in November and December, 2018. The performances will be held at the Cannon Center March 1-3 and 8-10, 2019.
- GCAC along with the Greer High School Art Club provided face painting at the Christmas Tree Lighting on December 7, 2018.

VII. Departmental Update

a) **Athletics Division** – Cory Holtzclaw, Athletic Supervisor

- Youth basketball league play and practices were facilitated at Victor Gym every weeknight and Saturday mornings. The 8U league is completely in house and plays at 6:15pm and 7:00pm. Victor Gym also facilitates some of the 10U and 12U games at 7:45pm. The goal for the winter 2019 season is to facilitate both 8U and 10U completely in house.
- Youth wrestling practices were held at Riverside High School every Tuesday and Thursday. On October 27th the first dual meet of the season will be hosted at Victor Gym. Some wrestlers will compete in tournaments around the state on Saturdays and select Sundays.
- Registration is currently open for youth baseball, softball and soccer for the spring season. Registrations will conclude early February and practices will begin in late February for soccer and early March for baseball. Foothills

Soccer Club of Greer Academy participants began practice on January 14th and state wide games will begin on February 5, 2019. With the academy teams soccer is utilizing fields year around.

- Athletic staff attended the South Carolina Athletic Planners Conference in Myrtle Beach, SC on November 6-7, 2018.
- Silbo from Raleigh, NC handles the managing and booking of our sports officials. Games and tournaments with criteria are posted on the app, officials book the ones they will officiate, Silbo pays them on-line and sends notification to the Athletics Division and charges the City of Greer via a MasterCard transaction.

b) **Cultural Arts Division** – Robin Byouk, Cultural Arts Supervisor

- The Giving Thanks Art Show reception was held at Greer City Hall before the City Council meeting on November 13, 2018. The theme was open to interpretation with 4 high schools participating welcoming double the amount of entries as last year.
- The entertainment for the Christmas Tree Lighting on December 7, 2018 was handled through the Cultural Arts Division.
- Upcoming Events:
 - Juried Arts Show on March 29, 2019 – City Hall
 - Friends of Lake Robinson Art Show on May 9, 2019 – City Hall

c) **Events Division** – Robbie Davis, Events Supervisor

- Since October 25th, the Events Division has hosted 60 internal events, 66 rentals, 9 special events, and 18 weddings with a total of 153 events that brought approximately 21,560 visitors to Greer City Park and Event venues.
- Christmas Tree lighting and Supper with Santa (City of Greer Employees) was held on December 7, 2018 with over 2,000 people at Greer City Park and the Cannon Centre.
- Breakfast with Santa was held on December 8, 2018 at the Cannon Centre with 500 people in attendance.
- Food Truck Rollout on January 19, 2019 was attended by over 1,000 people at Greer City Park. Greer CPW sponsored the event and a partnership with Greer Relief allowed for the sale of beer.
- Ambassador Program began on January 22, 2019. Three electric vehicles (shuttles) pickup patrons at area parking lots and deliver them to their destination in the downtown area. The shuttles run from 11am-2pm and 6pm-9pm Tuesday thru Saturday and Sundays from 2pm-6pm. This program is scheduled to run in conjunction with the Streetscapes project for the next 18 months. An app to track the locations of the shuttles and to request pickup is currently being evaluated.
- Upcoming Events:
 - Bridal Showcase on February 9, 2019 – City Hall & Cannon Centre
 - 6th Annual International Festival on April 27, 2019 – City Park

d) **Grounds Maintenance Division** – Travis Durham, Grounds Maintenance Superintendent

- Installation and removal of the Christmas banners along Hwy. 29, pole decorations on light poles throughout the downtown area and light pole garland within the downtown area and City Park.
- Travis Durham attended the Certified Playground Safety Inspectors course in Lexington, SC on November 1-2, 2018 and received his recertification.
- Four Grounds Maintenance staff attended the South Carolina Sports Turf Managers Association Conference in Myrtle Beach, SC on November 11-14, 2018.
- Grounds staff work an extra 312 man-hours during December of snow/ice removal, ice melt applications, clearing of sidewalks and steps and tree debris clean up at all parks and facilities.
- Carolina Parks and Play installed a new climber block unit and applied surrounding surfacing at City Park playground.
- The yearly process of the City Park pond cleaning will begin in February and should take approximately 5 working days with good weather.
- Rainfall for 2018 was 79.48” (33.91” above the yearly average). Only 2 months (March and June) recorded below the average monthly rainfall.

e) **Recreation Division** – Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- The 17th Annual Martin Luther King, Jr. luncheon was held on January 21, 2018 at Greer City Hall. Mayor Rick Danner was the keynote speaker and the food was provided by South House Restaurant. The event was a full house once again and everyone in attendance had a wonderful time.
- Summer Camp registration for both Camp Greer and Camp Needmore will begin on March 11th for City residents and March 18th for non-residents.
- Morse Code Classes began in January at the Victor Gym facility on Wednesday night with 12 students attending and the regular Ham Radio classes are held on Tuesday nights at the gym.
- The Seniors Out and Around (SOAR) group attended the BMW facility and enjoyed a tour.
- Indoor Pickleball was played at Victor Gym from 9am -12pm on Tuesday and Thursday. This programs has 30-40 participants at each session.

VIII. Financial Reports – Red Watson, Assistant Director

- a) Financials for the program funds in calendar year 2018 finished as expected. The funds finished in the black, which is our goal, and that money will be transferred to the cash balance account reserve fund.
- b) Fiscal Year 19/20 budget affords us the opportunity to start thinking about specific projects for the coming year.

Grants:

- Received confirmation and release of funds on both Parks and Recreation Development Grants for the outdoor restrooms at Victor Park and an accessible parking area at H. R. Turner Field.

- The Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant for the outdoor restrooms at H. R. Turner Field is scheduled to be completed in the Spring of 2019.
- South Carolina Parks, Recreation & Tourism questions were answered regarding the Recreation Trails Program Grant for the Center for the Arts and the grant was released to begin the project. The Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant, the SCPRT Grant and the 2 grants from GCRA will total just over \$200,000 for the year.

c) Kids Planet:

- Proposals were received from 8 playground companies for the project. Greer City staff project team met and evaluated the proposals and the field was narrowed down to 4 proposals. The 4 companies were contacted with additional questions about the details of their submittals. The City staff project team met again and selected a final 2 based on the feedback that was received from each company.
- A meeting will be scheduled with the full project steering committee and the 2 final playground equipment providers will make a formal presentation to the committee. A final recommendation will be presented to Greer City Council.
- Bluewater Civil Design, LLC Greenville, SC is developing the site plan, construction documents and a cost estimate for the site work.
- Kids Planet will remain open through Labor Day and demolition will be immediately after that day. The completion is estimated to be finished before Baseball Opening Day and the annual Easter Eggstastic event in the Spring of 2020.
 - Jason Bridwell inquired as to the type of structure that would replace the existing ones. Red Watson explained it is the department's desire for the new structures not to be wooden as there are safety issues and upkeep for that type of structure.

IX. Director's Report – Ann Cunningham, Director

a) Center for the Arts:

Demolition/construction has begun at the Center for the Arts. Electrical, plumbing and HVAC are in the process of installation; walls have been erected and sheet rock/mud are being applied. Concrete has been poured in the auditorium and the playground has been ordered and delivered to the Operations Center warehouse. Ann invited the trustees to contact her if they would like to visit the Center for the Arts during construction. Ann and Red showed a slide presentation to the trustees.

b) Downtown Walking & Bicycling Master Plan:

The Downtown Walking & Bicycling Master Plan was adopted by Greer City Council on January 12, 2016. Early planning stages with Alta Planning + Design will begin the process of obtaining cost estimates to develop proposed routes identified as priorities in making connections to parks, churches, library, schools, downtown for walking, bicycling, traffic calming and trails. Information is being planned to present the finding to Greer City Council at the Council Retreat in March.

- c) South Suber Road Park:
The brick house has been demolished and the well and septic tank were filled at the site adjacent to the park. This parcel was added to our South Suber Road Park property approximately 10 years ago. Once trees are removed, grading work to prepare the site will be self-performed by the Grounds Maintenance staff and crusher run gravel and fencing will be added. An exit only drive will be installed where the drive way is currently located to aid in safely leaving the site. Anticipated completion is mid to late spring 2019.
- d) Victor Park:
The gymnasium floor was refinished and Justin Miller and David Holtzclaw painted permanent pickleball court lines on the floor. This will allow the Parks and Recreation Department to save time and money on putting down tape lines for the court. This will also add a safer surface for play.
- e) Victor Gym:
New glass backboards with electric height adjusters have been added. Vanities in the restrooms have been replaced to comply with ADA standards. Fiscal year 19/20 final project for Victor Gym will be reglazing the bathroom floors.
- f) Streetscapes – www.futuregreer.com:
The 200 block of Trade Street is near completion. Sossamon Construction began breaking asphalt on January 24th for the 300 block of Trade Street. A portion of the street is blocked to all vehicle traffic although pedestrian access is available via the west sidewalk for County Bank, Pour Sports, Still Water Grill and Catering and Blue Ridge Brewing Company. Ambassadors are operating electric vehicles from various parking lots in the downtown area and shuttling patrons to their destinations in the downtown area.
- g) Operations Center Office Construction:
Renovations at the Operations Center for the Parks and Recreation Department administrative office space is in progress. Sheetrock work was completed, a new counter and window (ADA compliant) were installed and new carpet and paint will complete the project during January.
- h) Annual Report:
The department has been preparing for their upcoming Parks and Recreation Department Annual Report to be given to Greer City Council on February 12, 2019 in Council Chambers. Ann Cunningham invited the trustees to attend the meeting if their schedules permit.
- i) Tryon Tennis Facility:
Renovations to the outdoor restrooms at the Tryon Tennis facility are currently underway. New doors will be installed with time locks and the interior will get a new facelift.
- j) Department Participation:
 - On November 10, 2018 a Veterans Day event was held at Veterans Park. A World War I monument was unveiled and Dave Gorman, Retired Executive

Director of the Washington Headquarters DAV, was the guest speaker. Approximately 60 people attended the event. Ann Cunningham invited the trustees and the public to stop by Veterans Park and see the beautiful new monument, the wall of honor as well as the park itself.

- Several Parks and Recreation Department staff attended the South Carolina Recreation and Parks Association conference in Greenville, SC on November 12-14, 2018.

X. Old Business

- a) Meeting Dates for the 2019 year were reviewed and trustees were asked to put these dates on their calendars. A copy of the list is attached to the agenda.
- b) Ann Cunningham reminded the trustees if they have not done so to please make an appointment with Steve Owens, Communications Manager, to have their picture taken for the City of Greer website.

Department Projects

- ◆ Carpet was installed in the Operations Center conference room on January 14 and 15.
- ◆ On January 15, the Recreation Department project team met and narrowed the list of proposals to 2 for the Kids Planet playground equipment. A meeting will be scheduled in March with the Project Steering Committee to select a single proposal for recommendation.
- ◆ A pre-construction meeting for repairs to the Cannon Centre was held on January 15.
- ◆ On January 29, Ann Cunningham met with Donna Yarborough, President of Greer Council of Garden Clubs, regarding the Nancy Welch Monarch Butterfly Garden at Greer City Park.
- ◆ Bi-weekly construction meetings were held on site at the Center for the Arts. Department staff also met with Unified Technology Systems on January 29 to discuss the AV system for the new facility.
- ◆ Ann Cunningham and Red Watson met with Ruthie Helms and Steve Grant to review the construction of an ADA sidewalk connecting the pedestrian bridge and parking lot at Century Park.
- ◆ Contracts for PARD Grants were received for the Turner Field accessible parking area and the Victor Park outdoor restroom building.
- ◆ Ann Cunningham, Justin Miller, and Red Watson worked on maps illustrating recommended pathways for cost estimates from the Downtown Walking and Bicycling Master Plan.

Department Participation

- ◆ Staff attended the Streetscape Groundbreaking Ceremony on January 15 at The Davenport in Greer.
- ◆ The first quarter Greer Recreation Association Board meeting was held on January 24 at City Hall. Ann Cunningham introduced the new trustee, Jason Bridwell (District 6), to the board.
- ◆ Throughout the month, department staff worked on the 2019 Annual Presentation.

Department Trainings

- ◆ Justin Miller completed another 2-year certification to remain an instructor in CPR, First Aid, and AED for the Recreation Department.
- ◆ Ann Cunningham and Red Watson attended the SCRPA Southern Leisure & Management Trends Institute in Columbia, SC on January 31 and February 1.
- ◆ Several staff members attended Ambassador Driver Training.

Division Highlights

- ♦ The Ambassador Program began offering rides to downtown patrons on January 15. The 3 electric vehicles will transport patrons from designated parking lots to the downtown area during the Streetscapes project.
- ♦ On January 17, Ann Cunningham, Red Watson, and Justin Miller met with Lucas Croft at Century Park about the possibility of hosting the Disc Dog World Qualifying Event on Memorial Day weekend.

Grounds Maintenance

- ♦ Carolina Parks and Play installed a new climber block and surfacing at City Park playground.
- ♦ Division Staff:
 - Moved all furniture and cabinets out of OC offices for carpet and paint.
 - Began removing Christmas decorations from City Park and highway poles.
 - Prepared the grounds offices for painting and carpet installation.
 - Made adjustments to basketball goals at Victor Gym.
 - Completed the cleaning of the City Park pond.
 - Continued preparing and maintaining South Suber Road Soccer Complex and City Stadium for soccer practices and upcoming games.
 - Began preparing baseball and softball athletic facilities for the upcoming sports season.

Athletics:

- ♦ Division Staff:
 - Facilitated youth basketball practices at Victor Gym. The 8U division played games at Victor Gym on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday nights. The 10U and 12U divisions played games at Victor Gym and the Mauldin Sports Center on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday nights. The season will conclude in February.
 - Facilitated youth wrestling practices at Riverside High School on Tuesday and Thursday nights. Wrestlers competed in local tournaments beginning in January around the Upstate. Tomahawk Youth Wrestling hosted a duel with Boiling Springs and Mauldin at Victor Gym on January 26. The season will conclude on February 9 when Boiling Springs and Dorman visit Victor Gym for another duel.
 - Facilitated Academy Soccer practices/games at Greer City Stadium and Country Club Road Park for the 2019 spring season. There are 3 spring Academy teams that will compete in SCYSA games throughout the state. The season will continue through early May.
 - Hosted FSCG Board meeting on January 3 to review the fall season and preview the upcoming spring season.
- ♦ Spring registration for Greer Baseball Club, Girls' Softball, and Foothills Soccer Club of Greer took place for city residents and non-residents throughout the month. One week in February is being held as the last call for all spring sports programming.

Recreation:

- ♦ Ham Radio began new classes to start the year, and the instructors also introduced a Morse code class. There were 8-12 participants in this class in January.
- ♦ The Recreation Division also hosted the 17th Annual Dr. MLK Jr. Celebration Luncheon on January 21 at City Hall. Mayor Danner was the keynote speaker and the Sullivan Family provided entertainment. The 2019 Samaritan Award winners were Ernestine Whittenberg, Apostle Gerald Williams, and Pastor Kelly Williams. Another sellout crowd of 350 people enjoyed a great program.
- ♦ The Recreation Division continued to facilitate the following programs:
 - Senior Action – Needmore Recreation Center, Mondays-Fridays (200 participants monthly)
 - Piano Performers – Cannon Centre, Mondays (220 participants monthly)
 - Never Alone – Tryon Recreation Center, Tuesdays (80 participants monthly)
 - Cutlery Club – Tryon Recreation Center (20 participants monthly)
 - Artifacts Club – Tryon Recreation Center (74 participants monthly)
 - Pickleball – Victor Gym and Tryon Tennis Courts, Tuesdays and Thursdays (250 participants monthly)

- ♦ SOAR (Seniors Out and ARound)
 - SOAR had 4 Line Dance Classes this month on January 9, 16, 23, and 30 with an average of 34 seniors in attendance.
 - On January 10 a delicious lunch and 2 hours of bowling was enjoyed by 6 seniors at Spare Time in Greenville.
 - Movie Day was held on January 14. This month's movie was the romantic comedy "Dog Days". There were 15 seniors in attendance for this fun movie.
 - Bingo was held on January 3, 17, and 31 with an average of 14 SOAR members in attendance.
 - On January 25, a tour of the BMW Manufacturing Plant was attended by 25 seniors who had a great time learning the process of how these cars are manufactured every day in Greer.
 - Lunch Bunch was held on January 29 at the new Greer restaurant Select. There were 19 SOAR members in attendance to enjoy great food and fellowship.
 - The average attendance for the month was 19.

Cultural Arts:

- ♦ The Greer Children's Theatre started rehearsals for Lion King Jr at the Tryon Recreation Center every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. Promotional videos have been filmed to promote Lion King Jr on social media. The performances will be in March.
- ♦ Robin Byouk attended the Junior Theatre Festival in Atlanta on January 18-20. Over 5,000 children, teachers, and directors attended. There were performances, instructional classes, and informational sessions.
- ♦ The Arts Division worked on preparations for upcoming spring and summer activities including artwork and logistics.

Monthly Report for March 2019

Department Projects

- ◆ The roof stability project at the Cannon Centre was completed the week of March 15.
- ◆ A sidewalk has been installed at Century Park, which connects the pedestrian bridge to the parking lot, along with curbing at the lower entrance from the creek to the batting cages. An ADA sidewalk connecting the bridge to the parking lot was poured, as was curbing along the lower drive.
- ◆ Red Watson worked to complete bid specs for the outdoor restroom buildings at H. R. Turner and Victor Parks.
- ◆ Several trees were successfully removed from South Suber Road site.
- ◆ Bi-weekly construction meetings were held on-site at the Center for the Arts; attendees included staff from the Parks and Recreation Department, IT Department, Public Services, Hogan Construction, and SGA Architecture. Curbing has been poured at the site, with sidewalks to be poured in April. The facility is scheduled to begin occupancy in mid-June and the park in mid-July. This is subject to change due to inclement weather. A Grand Opening is planned for the fall.
