VI. Committee Reports

- a) Cheerleading Cory Holtzclaw, Athletic Supervisor
 - Marie Paris, Adhoc Representative and Cheerleading Coach requested the cheerleaders cheer for some of the basketball games at Victor Gym. The participants had a great time.
 - b) Cultural Arts Robin Byouk Cultural Arts Supervisor
 - Greer Children's Theatre performed the full length version, Annie, at the J Harley Bonds Career Center on November 9-11 and November 16-18, 2018. Fox Carolina broadcast their early morning news report from the J. Harley Bonds Center with the Annie cast on opening day.
 - Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC) sponsored the "Lest We Forget" Veterans Musical Tribute by the Upstate Men's Choir at the Cannon Center on November 11, 2018.
 - Auditions and rehearsals for the Lion King Jr were held in November and December, 2018. The performances will be held at the Cannon Center March 1-3 and 8-10, 2019.
 - GCAC along with the Greer High School Art Club provided face painting at the Christmas Tree Lighting on December 7, 2018.

VII. Departmental Update

- a) Athletics Division Cory Holtzclaw, Athletic Supervisor
 - Youth basketball league play and practices were facilitated at Victor Gym every weeknight and Saturday mornings. The 8U league is completely in house and plays at 6:15pm and 7:00pm. Victor Gym also facilitates some of the 10U and 12U games at 7:45pm. The goal for the winter 2019 season is to facilitate both 8U and 10U completely in house.
 - Youth wrestling practices were held at Riverside High School every Tuesday and Thursday. On October 27th the first dual meet of the season will be hosted at Victor Gym. Some wrestlers will compete in tournaments around the state on Saturdays and select Sundays.
 - Registration is currently open for youth baseball, softball and soccer for the spring season. Registrations will conclude early February and practices will begin in late February for soccer and early March for baseball. Foothills

Soccer Club of Greer Academy participants began practice on January 14th and state wide games will begin on February 5, 2019. With the academy teams soccer is utilizing fields year around.

- Athletic staff attended the South Carolina Athletic Planners Conference in Myrtle Beach, SC on November 6-7, 2018.
- Silbo from Raleigh, NC handles the managing and booking of our sports officials. Games and tournaments with criteria are posted on the app, officials book the ones they will officiate, Silbo pays them on-line and sends notification to the Athletics Division and charges the City of Greer via a MasterCard transaction.

b) Cultural Arts Division – Robin Byouk, Cultural Arts Supervisor

- The Giving Thanks Art Show reception was held at Greer City Hall before the City Council meeting on November 13, 2018. The theme was open to interpretation with 4 high schools participating welcoming double the amount of entries as last year.
- The entertainment for the Christmas Tree Lighting on December 7, 2018 was handled through the Cultural Arts Division.
- Upcoming Events:

 - o Friends of Lake Robinson Art Show on May 9, 2019 City Hall

c) Events Division – Robbie Davis, Events Supervisor

- Since October 25th, the Events Division has hosted 60 internal events, 66 rentals, 9 special events, and 18 weddings with a total of 153 events that brought approximately 21,560 visitors to Greer City Park and Event venues.
- Christmas Tree lighting and Supper with Santa (City of Greer Employees) was held on December 7, 2018 with over 2,000 people at Greer City Park and the Cannon Centre.
- Breakfast with Santa was held on December 8, 2018 at the Cannon Centre with 500 people in attendance.
- Food Truck Rollout on January 19, 2019 was attended by over 1,000 people at Greer City Park. Greer CPW sponsored the event and a partnership with Greer Relief allowed for the sale of beer.
- Ambassador Program began on January 22, 2019. Three electric vehicles (shuttles) pickup patrons at area parking lots and deliver them to their destination in the downtown area. The shuttles run from 11am-2pm and 6pm-9pm Tuesday thru Saturday and Sundays from 2pm-6pm. This program is scheduled to run in conjunction with the Streetscapes project for the next 18 months. An app to track the locations of the shuttles and to request pickup is currently being evaluated.
- Upcoming Events:

 - o 6th Annual International Festival on April 27, 2019 City Park

- d) **Grounds Maintenance Division** Travis Durham, Grounds Maintenance Superintendent
 - Installation and removal of the Christmas banners along Hwy. 29, pole decorations on light poles throughout the downtown area and light pole garland within the downtown area and City Park.
 - Travis Durham attended the Certified Playground Safety Inspectors course in Lexington, SC on November 1-2, 2018 and received his recertification.
 - Four Grounds Maintenance staff attended the South Carolina Sports Turf Managers Association Conference in Myrtle Beach, SC on November 11-14, 2018.
 - Grounds staff work an extra 312 man-hours during December of snow/ice removal, ice melt applications, clearing of sidewalks and steps and tree debris clean up at all parks and facilities.
 - Carolina Parks and Play installed a new climber block unit and applied surrounding surfacing at City Park playground.
 - The yearly process of the City Park pond cleaning will begin in February and should take approximately 5 working days with good weather.
 - Rainfall for 2018 was 79.48" (33.91" above the yearly average). Only 2 months (March and June) recorded below the average monthly rainfall.

e) **Recreation Division** – Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- The 17th Annual Martin Luther King, Jr. luncheon was held on January 21, 2018 at Greer City Hall. Mayor Rick Danner was the keynote speaker and the food was provided by South House Restaurant. The event was a full house once again and everyone in attendance had a wonderful time.
- Summer Camp registration for both Camp Greer and Camp Needmore will begin on March 11th for City residents and March 18th for non-residents.
- Morse Code Classes began in January at the Victor Gym facility on Wednesday night with 12 students attending and the regular Ham Radio classes are held on Tuesday nights at the gym.
- The Seniors Out and Around (SOAR) group attended the BMW facility and enjoyed a tour.
- Indoor Pickleball was played at Victor Gym from 9am -12pm on Tuesday and Thursday. This programs has 30-40 participants at each session.

VIII. Financial Reports – Red Watson, Assistant Director

- a) Financials for the program funds in calendar year 2018 finished as expected. The funds finished in the black, which is our goal, and that money will be transferred to the cash balance account reserve fund.
- b) Fiscal Year 19/20 budget affords us the opportunity to start thinking about specific projects for the coming year.

Grants:

• Received confirmation and release of funds on both Parks and Recreation Development Grants for the outdoor restrooms at Victor Park and an accessible parking area at H. R. Turner Field.

- The Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant for the outdoor restrooms at H. R. Turner Field is scheduled to be completed in the Spring of 2019.
- South Carolina Parks, Recreation & Tourism questions were answered regarding the Recreation Trails Program Grant for the Center for the Arts and the grant was released to begin the project. The Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant, the SCPRT Grant and the 2 grants from GCRA will total just over \$200,000 for the year.

c) Kids Planet:

- Proposals were received from 8 playground companies for the project. Greer City staff project team met and evaluated the proposals and the field was narrowed down to 4 proposals. The 4 companies were contacted with additional questions about the details of their submittals. The City staff project team met again and selected a final 2 based on the feedback that was received from each company.
- A meeting will be scheduled with the full project steering committee and the 2 final playground equipment providers will make a formal presentation to the committee. A final recommendation will be presented to Greer City Council.
- Bluewater Civil Design, LLC Greenville, SC is developing the site plan, construction documents and a cost estimate for the site work.
- Kids Planet will remain open through Labor Day and demolition will be immediately after that day. The completion is estimated to be finished before Baseball Opening Day and the annual Easter Eggtastic event in the Spring of 2020.
 - o Jason Bridwell inquired as to the type of structure that would replace the existing ones. Red Watson explained it is the department's desire for the new structures not to be wooden as there are safety issues and upkeep for that type of structure.

IX. <u>Director's Report</u> – Ann Cunningham, Director

a) Center for the Arts:

Demolition/construction has begun at the Center for the Arts. Electrical, plumbing and HVAC are in the process of installation; walls have been erected and sheet rock/mud are being applied. Concrete has been poured in the auditorium and the playground has been ordered and delivered to the Operations Center warehouse. Ann invited the trustees to contact her if they would like to visit the Center for the Arts during construction. Ann and Red showed a slide presentation to the trustees.

b) Downtown Walking & Bicycling Master Plan:

The Downtown Walking & Bicycling Master Plan was adopted by Greer City Council on January 12, 2016. Early planning stages with Alta Planning + Design will begin the process of obtaining cost estimates to develop proposed routes identified as priorities in making connections to parks, churches, library, schools, downtown for walking, bicycling, traffic calming and trails. Information is being planned to present the finding to Greer City Council at the Council Retreat in March.

c) South Suber Road Park:

The brick house has been demolished and the well and septic tank were filled at the site adjacent to the park. This parcel was added to our South Suber Road Park property approximately 10 years ago. Once trees are removed, grading work to prepare the site will be self-performed by the Grounds Maintenance staff and crusher run gravel and fencing will be added. An exit only drive will be installed where the drive way is currently located to aid in safely leaving the site. Anticipated completion is mid to late spring 2019.

d) Victor Park:

The gymnasium floor was refinished and Justin Miller and David Holtzclaw painted permanent pickleball court lines on the floor. This will allow the Parks and Recreation Department to save time and money on putting down tape lines for the court. This will also add a safer surface for play.

e) Victor Gym:

New glass backboards with electric height adjusters have been added Vanities in the restrooms have been replaced to comply with ADA standards. Fiscal year 19/20 final project for Victor Gym will be reglazing the bathroom floors.

f) Streetscapes – <u>www.futuregreer.com</u>:

The 200 block of Trade Street is near completion. Sossamon Construction began breaking asphalt on January 24th for the 300 block of Trade Street. A portion of the street is blocked to all vehicle traffic although pedestrian access is available via the west sidewalk for County Bank, Pour Sports, Still Water Grill and Catering and Blue Ridge Brewing Company. Ambassadors are operating electric vehicles from various parking lots in the downtown area and shuttling patrons to their destinations in the downtown area.

g) Operations Center Office Construction:

Renovations at the Operations Center for the Parks and Recreation Department administrative office space is in progress. Sheetrock work was completed, a new counter and window (ADA compliant) were installed and new carpet and paint will complete the project during January.

h) Annual Report:

The department has been preparing for their upcoming Parks and Recreation Department Annual Report to be given to Greer City Council on February 12, 2019 in Council Chambers. Ann Cunningham invited the trustees to attend the meeting if their schedules permit.

i) Tryon Tennis Facility:

Renovations to the outdoor restrooms at the Tryon Tennis facility are currently underway. New doors will be installed with time locks and the interior will get a new facelift.

i) Department Participation:

• On November 10, 2018 a Veterans Day event was held at Veterans Park. A World War I monument was unveiled and Dave Gorman, Retired Executive

Director of the Washington Headquarters DAV, was the guest speaker. Approximately 60 people attended the event. Ann Cunningham invited the trustees and the public to stop by Veterans Park and see the beautiful new monument, the wall of honor as well as the park itself.

• Several Parks and Recreation Department staff attended the South Carolina Recreation and Parks Association conference in Greenville, SC on November 12-14, 2018.

X. Old Business

- a) Meeting Dates for the 2019 year were reviewed and trustees were asked to put these dates on their calendars. A copy of the list is attached to the agenda.

V. Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting

Minutes were not approved as there was not a quorum present.

VI. Committee Reports

- a) Cultural Arts Don Poinsette Adhoc Representative
 - Greer Children's Theatre held 8 performances of Lion King Jr on May 1-3 and May 8-10 at the Cannon Centre. Four of the performances were sold out with more than 220 people in attendance at each performance.
 - Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC) along with the Greer High School National Honor Society offered face painting at the Eggtastic event.
 - GCAC will host the craft area for the International Festival on April 27th. Volunteers from Greer Middle College, Leadership Greer, members of the Cultural Arts Theater group, and GCAC Board and Student Board of Directors. Greer Middle College Leadership Board assisted with the crafts.
 - On May 11th a Yartsale will be held with the proceeds benefiting GCAC.
 - Greer Idol and Tunes in the Park will begin on June 14th.

b) **Tennis** – Red Watson – Assistant Director Parks and Recreation

• Resurfacing of the clay courts began the week of April 22, 2019 and will be completed by the end of the day on April 29, 2019.

VII. <u>Departmental Update</u>

- a) Athletics Division Red Watson, Assistant Director Parks and Recreation
 - The athletics division is currently facilitating programming 7 days of the week.
 - Opening Day for baseball and softball participants was held on March 29th. Teams were introduced, Homerun Derby competitions were held, and the coach of the year, Ashley Hughes Cheerleading, was introduced. Michael Roth, former California Angels MLB player and Greer native, visited to throw out the first pitch.
 - Greer Baseball Club practices and games for all participants ages 3-14 are currently underway. Stevens Field, Riverside Middle, Century Park, Country Club Road Park, Little Turner Field and Davenport Field are utilized to practice and play games for nearly 500 kids.
 - Greer softball participants practice and play games Monday Saturday at Victor Park, Riverside Middle School and Tyger River Park. All players competed in the Diamond Dirt Classic preseason tournament at Tiger River Park
 - Foothills Soccer Club of Greer is currently in season at South Suber Road Park and City Stadium. Recreational and Academy teams are competing 4-5 days each week.
 - Flag football, tackle football and cheerleading registration will begin on May 1st for City of Greer residents and May 8th for all participants. The goal this year is to play all age groups in house at Country Club Road Park. This will depend on the number of participants in each age group. Two competitions for all cheerleaders are planned for the preseason. Cheerleaders will cheer for flag and tackle teams during the season.

b) **Cultural Arts Division** – Robin Byouk, Cultural Arts Supervisor

- The 2019 Juried Art Show reception was held on March 29th in the Wall Gallery at Greer City Hall. The 2 themes this year were: Where we have been and Where we are going. The entry turn in was light but the quality was very good. The City of Greer purchased 4 of the winning pieces.
- The Cultural Arts Division is responsible for the International Festival entertainment.
- Robin Byouk visited a clay coop studio in Charleston, SC. A few important changes, gleamed from her visit, were made to the new pottery studio at the Center for the Arts prior to construction completion.
- Applications for Artist in Residence and instructors have been sent out for the Center for the Arts this fall.

c) Events Division – Robbie Davis, Events Supervisor

- The Greater Greer Bridal Showcase was held on February 9th and hosted over 150 current and potential clients. Guests had an opportunity to talk with local wedding vendors and caterers and to also view set up options inside the Greer City Hall Event Halls.
- Planning for the International Festival on April 27th with over 26 countries featured, 13 non-profit organizations, 8 sports, and 12 food vendors. There are 17 performances schedule inside Greer City Hall and on the

- Amphitheater. Free crafts and a petting zoo are also offered. Kids are given a map and will be able to travel to the different countries and receive a sticker at each stop.
- The Greer Council of Garden Clubs was recently rewarded a grant through the Greer Development Corporation to create a butterfly garden in Greer City Park. The Nancy Welch Butterfly Garden will be dedicated at the International Festival at 11am on April 27th.
- The Food Truck Rollout will be held May 17th. There are 6 trucks lined up for the event. Mark Webb Jr. will be performing during the event.
- Moonlight Movies series will start on June 6 with the following movies:
 - o The Incredibles 2
 - Small Foot
 - Hook
 - o Ralph Breaks the Internet
 - Space Jam
 - o Cars 3
 - o The Grinch
 - How to Train You Dragon
- The 11th Annual Freedom Blast will be held on June 29th. Meetings have been held with all the military organizations and the details are being finalized. The event will be held at 6:00pm until 10:30pm with the fireworks display taking place at approximately 10:00pm.
- Since January 24th the Events Division has hosted 102 internal events, 54 rentals, 9 special events and 16 weddings with a total of 173 events that brought approximately 12,490 people to Greer City Park, Events Halls and the Cannon Centre.
- The Greer Station Shuttles are running Tuesday Sunday; Tuesday Saturday 11am-2pm and 6pm-9pm with Sundays running from 10:30am-3pm. The program numbers are being monitored to determine if we are meeting the demands. The peak shuttle shifts are Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The Ambassador Program is currently averaging 11 people per day. An app to track the locations of the shuttles and to request pickup is currently being evaluated.
- Marc Metcalf gave kudos to the staff for a great job during his son's birthday party at the picnic shelter. He commented several people from the downtown Greenville area who did not realize the park existed. Marc said this gave his wife and he a great opportunity to brag on Greer.
- d) **Grounds Maintenance Division** Travis Durham, Grounds Maintenance Superintendent
 - New Basketball backboards and rims were installed at Victor Gym outdoor courts.
 - Stevens Field, Century Park, Needmore Recreation Center and South Suber Road Park landscape beds were mulched. Pine straw was added to Country Club Road Park landscape beds.
 - Staff assisted in replacing the well pump at City Park pond.
 - Modern Turf laser graded and added infield clay to the baseball infields at Country Club Road Park.

- Ryegrass was removed from City Stadium and South Suber Road Park.
- New landscape was installed along Hwy 14 side of the City of Greer Courthouse and new landscape and mulch was installed within Greer City Park
- A new ADA sidewalk was installed at the Century Park pedestrian bridge.
- Installation and removal of the Christmas banners along Hwy. 29, pole decorations on light poles throughout the downtown area and light pole garland within the downtown area and City Park.
- Staff continued to prepare athletic facilities for spring practice and games.
 They also continue to maintain the City of Greer neighborhood parks and recreation facilities.
- Rainfall since the January 2019 meeting was 18.5", this yields a +3.75" since January 24th and +9.82" since January 1st.

e) **Recreation Division** – Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- Summer Camp registration began mid-March and both camps are completely full.
- Summer camp counselor positions have been interviewed with several counselors returning from last year.
- The Eggtastic Easter event saw the biggest crowd to date with approximately 2,300 attendees. A big thank you to Suber Road Baptist Church volunteers, Texas Roadhouse, Residences at Century, Greer Cultural Arts Council and the Parks and Recreation staff.
- Senior Computer classes began in March and the last session will he held April 30th.
- The Recreation Division will be staffing the Sports Zone at the International Festival.

VIII. Financial Reports – Red Watson, Assistant Director

a) Financials for the program funds for the 2019 calendar year is doing really well. Revenue for baseball is up due to increased participation. Revenue for soccer is on target. Overall all the program funds have seen an increase in sponsorships. Kudos to Justin Miller for getting out there and chasing down money to support his programs.

b) Grants:

 Bid specs have been completed for the outdoor restroom buildings for Turner Field and Victor Park. This project will be funded by the Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant. Currently a site plan is being developed and when completed advertising for bids will proceed. The Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant for the outdoor restrooms at H. R. Turner Field is scheduled to be completed in the Spring of 2019.

c) Kids Planet:

• On March 17th, the 2 playground equipment provider finalists presented their proposals to the Kids Planet Steering Committee at Greer City Hall. The committee scored each one based on a series of criteria and 1 vendor

was selected for recommendation. The information was presented to Mr. Driggers along with the recommendation and it was agreed to move forward to present the recommendation to Greer City Council on May 14th. A Community Development Block Grant through the Greenville County Redevelopment Authority is being pursued to assist in paying for the grading of the site and sidewalks.

IX. <u>Director's Report</u> – Ann Cunningham, Director

a) Annual Report

Ann Cunningham gave a brief overview of the Parks and Recreation Department's Annual Report to Greer City Council on February 12th. The printed annual report was given to each Recreation Association Board member.

- b) Ann thanked her staff for all the work and time for the projects and events. She also thanked the Cultural Arts Council, the Recreation Association Board and the Adhoc Representatives for all their time and support throughout the year.

 Ann Cunningham gave an update on the project as the mason's installed pavers in the 300 block of Trade Street. Utility work is being done on the 200 block of Trade Street. She reminded everyone to sign up for the futuregreer.com to stay informed of the progress of the project.

Department Projects

This will give the contractor time to complete all of the landscaping and final preparations of the surrounding parking lots.
 - o Landscaping in the park has begun with the installation of plant materials.
 - Most of the trail and concrete sidewalks have been completed with the exception of the limestone walkways that will be added in early July. CPW has begun installing parking lot and decorative acorn light poles throughout the park. The surrounding streetlights will also be changed to match the park LED light bulbs.
 - Exterior painting, final landscaping, installation of arbors, a kiosk, signage, playground equipment and parking lot modifications are scheduled to be completed in July.
 - Grand Opening activities are in the planning stages for the weekend of September 20...
- On June 5, the Parks and Recreation Department's management team met with David Langley, Ruthie Helms, and Dan Fowler at the Country Club Road Park concession/press box facility to discuss options for repairing the leaks in the roof over the bathrooms. David Langley originally designed the structure.
- Color samples for pour in place surfacing and playground equipment were obtained for the Kids Planet Renovation Project. The contract with Blue Water Civil Engineering has been revised and updating of construction documents is in process. A pre-construction meeting will be held in July to prepare for bid advertisement.

Two shade structures were installed in the seating areas at Country Club Road Park. While 4 were originally budgeted at this site, we saw an opportunity to provide shade in a more crucial seating area at another facility. The remaining 2 shade structures were installed at Victor Park. It is our intention to install the 2 shade structures at Country Club Road Park in the current budget year with dollars that were already budgeted for shade structures at Victor Park.

Department Participation

- Interviews were conducted for the Full Time Cultural Arts Coordinator. Congratulations to Sara Odom, who was promoted from Part Time Cultural Arts Assistant!
- The Parks and Recreation Department hosted the SCRPA Western District workshop at City Hall. Approximately 40 people participated in customer service and human resources training.
- Red Watson conducted media interviews to distribute information about the upcoming renovations to Kids Planet.
- The City of Greer hosted the 11th Annual Freedom Blast on June 29. It is estimated that over 15,000 guests attended the downtown celebration. The Cultural Arts Division mounted veteran's pictures to be displayed on the Wall Gallery at Greer City Hall. Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC) was the beverage provider and with great weather the sales doubled from prior years.

Department Trainings

- Justin Miller held 2 sessions of CPR, First Aid, and AED trainings for summer camp counselors and Cultural Arts camp teachers.
- Summer camp counselors participated in Active Shooter training with the Greer Police Department.

 - Completed an application of Ronstar pre-emerge herbicide to Center for the Arts in preparation for sod installation.
 - Delivered trash cans and benches to Carolina Chem-Strip to begin the powder coating process.
 - Continued to maintain neighborhood parks, athletic facilities, recreational facilities, and Greer City Park.

Athletics:

- Fall sports registration opened for baseball, softball, and soccer. Registration will conclude on July 14.

The 6U will play in Columbia, 8U in Dillon, 10U in Anderson, and 12U in Bluffton.
 - Facilitated the Frohawk Creek Scramble baseball tournament at Century Park and Victor Park on June 1-2. Age divisons for the tournament included 6U, 8U, 10U, and 12U. Twenty teams from around the upstate competed in the tournament.
