**August 22, 2019**

**I. Call to Order**

Wayne Yount (Chairman) called to order the regular meeting of the Greer Recreation Association Board at 6:17pm on August 22, 2019 at Greer City Hall, Hall A.

**VI. Committee Reports**

a) **Cultural Arts** – Don Poinsette – Adhoc Representative

- Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC) was the beverage provider for Freedom Blast in partnership with the Knights of Columbus to sell the beer products. Sales were the best they have been in 10 years.

- Greer Idol and Greer Idol Jr were held during Tunes in the Park. Good weather was a great advantage and the crowds were very large this season. Mac Arnold and Plate O' Blues drew the largest crowd. The Greer Idol winner was Kendall Langford and the Greer Idol Jr winner was Brady Green.
  - Three summer camps were held; 2 beginner and 1 advanced camp. All 3 camps were at capacity and additional students were admitted with eleven scholarships offered to students at the Needmore Summer Camp program at the first beginner camp. The advanced camp performed Willy Wonka Jr. at the Cannon Center, August 9 – 18. The performances were free and 4 of the 6 shows were at capacity.
  - Greer Children Theatre cast Beauty and the Beast and started rehearsals at the Tryon Recreation Center. Performances will be November 8 – 17 on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.
  - The Grand Opening Gala for the Center for the Arts is scheduled for September 20 with entertainment including Emile Pandolfi, International Renowned Pianist, Noah Guthrie from America's Got Talent and Jarod Emerson, exceptional performance artist. Marcus Gaston will be the Master of Ceremony for the evening.
- b) **Tennis** – Red Watson – Assistant Director Parks and Recreation
- Resurfacing of the clay courts was completed the end of April.
- c) **Cheerleading** – Cory Holtzclaw – Athletics Supervisor
- Marie Paris, Cheerleading Adhoc Representative, will be stepping down at the end of this year.
- d) **DAV** – Robert Robinson – Adhoc Representative and JC Crenshaw, DAV Commander
- Bruce Clayton gave the DAV a price of \$40 per brick with the engraving included.
  - DAV continues to assist disabled veterans with necessities and rent as well as fixing their homes.
  - Robert thanked the Greer Parks and Recreation Department, Recreation Association Board and the City of Greer for all their support.

## **VII. Departmental Update**

- a) **Athletics Division** – Cory Holtzclaw, Athletics Supervisor
- Foothills Soccer Club of Greer completed spring play for the 2019 season. The fall recreation league began the week of August 19. Fall 2019 academy soccer practices began in July after the completion of their spring season. Soccer programs are run Monday, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.
  - Greer Baseball Club completed the 2019 spring season in June. Teams competed Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesday, Thursdays and Saturdays at Century Park, Country Club Road Park and Stevens Field. The 2019 6U, 8U, 10U and 12U all-star teams won their district championships and competed in state tournaments. The 6U team won the City of Greer Parks

and Recreation Department's first ever South Carolina Dixie Youth State Championship.

- Greer Girls Softball completed the 2019 spring season in June. The 8U, 10U and 12U teams competed every Monday and Thursday nights at Victor Park and Tyger River Park. The fall 2019 season practices began the week of August 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Football currently has 20 combined teams including flag and tackle football. The flag football league has grown to the point where all games and teams are in house, meaning there is no need to travel to compete against other teams. This league is in its second year of participation. Flag football is one of the fastest growing programs offered.
- Cheerleading boasts approximately 60 girls cheering for both the flag and tackle football teams. A preseason cheer camp was held at Pelham Baptist Life Center where participants were introduced to stunts, cheers and routines during the week long camp. All cheer squads began their season on August 24 at the preseason tackle jamboree.
- The Men's Adult Baseball has six age 30 and over Wooden Bat Baseball teams competing Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at Steven Field. Teams and players come from all over the upstate to participate.
- American Legion Baseball completed their season at Stevens Field. The Greer Post 115 Senior Legion team won the South Carolina State Tournament.
- Wrestling registration will begin in October with conditioning at Riverside High School every Tuesday and Thursday. The season will run from November to March. Participants are not required to participate in tournaments but are encouraged to register for the tournaments.
- Youth basketball registration will begin in October. The goal is to register enough participants to have all age groups play in house. The 8U division was completely in house last season. Youth basketball is another one of the fastest growing programs offered.

**b) Cultural Arts Division – Robin Byouk, Cultural Arts Supervisor**

- Veterans photos were hung in the Wall Gallery for Freedom Blast and Jennifer Mills artwork was displayed during the summer.
- Staff assisted with the entertainment for Freedom Blast; including the Pitchhitters (men's vocal group), stilt walkers, chalk artist and murals.
- Staff along with GCAC volunteers did face painting of superhero faces at National Night Out in Greer City Park on August 6.
- Robin Byouk and Sara Odom held interviews for the artist studios, classes, workshops and the gallery at the Center for the Arts
- The Grand Opening will be held on September 21 and 22. The Dedication Ceremony will be held at 10:45am on Saturday followed by indoor and outdoor entertainment on both stages. Inside will be Artists in Residence studios open, Featured Artist, Christina Laurel, pottery demonstrations by Dana Kimmell, Balloon Artist, and Magician - JJ Pearson. In addition, the Quatrophonics, Sonny G, the cast of Beauty and the Beast, Greenville Dance Collective and the Greenville Jazz Ensemble will perform. Outside both the Main Street and Royal Blue Group will be on stage in the

amphitheater. The chalk artist will display their work outside the entrance to the Performing Arts. Food trucks, adult beverages and Pepsi will be available from 11am-4pm. On Sunday the center will be open for tours from 1pm-5pm.

c) **Events Division** – Robbie Davis, Events Supervisor

- Greer Family Fest was held at City Park on May 3 and 4. This event is hosted by the Greater Greer Chamber of Commerce and the two day festival brought over 10,000 people into the park and downtown Greer Station.
- The Greer Farmers Market began on May 25 with the City of Greer as the main sponsor. The market has over 30 vendors and offers morning yoga classes, a plant sale and plenty of fresh fruits and vegetables from local vendors.
- Moonlight Movies commenced on June 6 and averages 800 people in attendance each week. In partnership with Greer Event Rentals, Community Chiropractic, Plate 108 and local churches movie goers have an opportunity to play on a jump castle, dance, enjoy a free craft and free raffles.
- The 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Freedom Blast was a success. Freedom Blast continues to increase in attendance with over 15,000 people enjoying the event. Ashland Craft headlined this year's event with 7 military and veteran groups and 11 food vendors being hosted.
- August 16 the Food Truck Rollout was held in Greer City Park. The City teamed up with Greer CPW as a sponsor where Call Before You Dig Celebration was held. There were five food trucks and one dessert truck. Eli Edwards Project performed for a crowd of 500 people.
- Since April 25 the Events Division has hosted:
  - 117 internal events
  - 102 rentals
  - 32 special events
  - 33 weddings

A total of 284 events that brought approximately 59,450 people to Greer City Park, Events Halls and the Cannon Centre.

- The Ambassadors Program Shuttles are running; Tuesday – Saturday 11am-2pm and 6pm-9pm with Sundays running from 10:30am-3pm. A total of 6,644 people have utilized the program since the January 15 start. The program numbers are being monitored to determine if we are meeting the demands. The peak shuttle shifts are Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The number of ride request have been 510 and are tracked from the ride hailing app Mytrax GPS. The program is currently averaging 20 people per day.

d) **Grounds Maintenance Division** – Travis Durham, Grounds Maintenance Superintendent

- New landscaping and sod, complete with drip and spray irrigation, was installed along Hwy 101/Line Street side of Victor Gym.
- Greer City Park lower fountain was re-waterproofed by WP Law.
- Staff received system training on the HVAC, irrigation, fire system and lighting at the Center for the Arts.
- New benches were installed at the Center for the Arts.

- The mobile stage was set up and removed for the Benson Car Show Classic at Greer First Baptist Church.
- New landscaping was installed along Oakland Avenue at the Tryon Recreation Center.
- Staff prepared athletic fields for the start of the fall season and continued to maintain all athletic facilities, recreational facilities, neighborhood parks, Greer City Park and Center for the Arts.
- Rainfall since the April 25 meeting was 14.00", this yields a -3.16 year to date.

e) **Recreation Division** – Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- Summer Camp ended on August 9 with both camps at maximum capacity.
- India Jackson was hired as a part-time recreation leader working at the Needmore Recreation Center.
- Currently interviewing for a fulltime position as a Recreation Coordinator.
- New ham radio and Morse code classes will begin in the fall at the Victor Gym.
- The Needmore After School program will begin on August 19 and the Creative Advancement After School program will begin on September 3 at the Victor Gym.

**VIII. Financial Reports** – Red Watson, Assistant Director

- a) Program funds financials for the FY 18/19 finished as expected. All the projects from this fund budgeted for last year were funded.
- b) Grants:
- The reimbursement forms for the Recreation Trails Program Grant in the amount of \$100,000 are in the process of being completed. This grant assisted in funding the trail at the Center for the Arts.
  - Approximately \$29,000 in funds through the Accommodations Tax Grant are assisting in the purchasing of FF&E items for the Center for the Arts.
  - Bids will be advertised for the outdoor restroom buildings at Victor Park and Turner Field as well as an accessible parking area at Turner Field. These projects will be partially funded by the Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant of \$37,500 and the Parks and Recreation Development Fund Grant of \$49,910.
  - The Greenville County Redevelopment Authority, Community Development Block Grant funds will allow for accessibility items such as pathways and parking spaces for the Kids Planet Renovation. This fund is expected to be between \$200,000 and \$300,000.
  - Greenville County Redevelopment Authority, Community Development Block Grant – Sub Recipient Funds were approved to assist in the Needmore Summer Camp and Senior Computer Classes for the upcoming program year.
  - Department staff will be reviewing options for the upcoming Parks and Recreation Development Fund Grant cycle.



c) Kids Planet:

- The approval for the Greenville County Re-Development Authority, Community Development Block Grant funds are huge for the Kids Planet Project. This grant freed up additional money to allow the completion of the entire project at one time instead of phases.
- Cunningham Recreation worked with department staff to complete colors for the pour in place surfacing and playground equipment. Bluewater Civil Engineering is also working with the staff to finalize the design allowing for construction documents to be submitted for permitting review by the City of Greer and for CDBG review by GCRA. Once this step is complete bids will be advertised.
- Kids Planet will be closed on September 3. The Grounds Maintenance staff will then start removing the personalized items throughout Kids Planet and store them in the Operations Center warehouse. After the project is complete and Kids Planet has re-opened, the Cultural Arts division will work to creatively display those personalized items in Kids Planet. If the public would like to collect their items and not have them displayed, they will have that option as well.
- Steve Owens, Communication Manager for the City, is creating a dedicated page on FutureGreer.com where the public can track the progress of construction throughout the project and to see firsthand the new Kids Planet as it is built.

**IX. Director's Report – Ann Cunningham, Director**

a) Center for the Arts

Punch lists for the facility interior, exterior and park are currently being worked on with the department staff and Hogan Construction. A temporary Certificate of Occupancy was given to the City for the facility. Outside equipment and signage will be installed by mid-September. The playground is scheduled to open mid-September. Inspections are in the process of being conducted for ADA compliance. Ann Cunningham presented pictures of the facility.

b) ADA Facility Renovations

The department staff is continuing to work with the City's ADA Manager on making improvements to facilities and parks that are outlined in the department's transition plans. The most recent projects in addition to the Center for the Arts and Kids Planet include Springwood Park, located at 601 West Arlington Avenue. Handicapped parking spaces will be added on Green Street to allow for access to the playground and surrounding park. An accessible walkway will be added to the outdoor restrooms at Tryon Park. The walkway will connect to the upper tennis courts.

c) HVAC System

There will be an HVAC system installed at the Victor Gym facility.

d) Streetscapes – [www.futuregreer.com](http://www.futuregreer.com)

Ann Cunningham gave an update on the project as construction crews are currently working on the 100 block of Trade Street. Some closure may affect commuters during this project.

Greer Station shuttles are available to deliver patrons to downtown destinations quickly and at no charge. Patrons and visitors can flag down the shuttle for a ride or download the MyTrax GPS app that allows them to track shuttle locations and request a pickup. Full details are available at <http://www.futuregreer.com/greer-station-shuttles>.

The Trade Street portion of the Streetscapes project is ahead of schedule. If the rate of work continues, weather permitting, Trade Street may reopen by early November. The intersections at Trade Street/Victoria Street and Trade Street/Randall Street will not be renovated until the spring of 2020.

The expansion of existing Christmas decorations for the acorn poles throughout downtown as well as new poles on Trade Street are in process of preparation.

### Department Projects

- ◆ Center for the Arts:
  - Bi-weekly construction meetings were held.
  - Training on items such as irrigation and HVAC were conducted on July 17.
  - Staff attended a pre-bid meeting for window blinds on July 30.
  - On July 31, Ann Cunningham and Robin Byouk met with Angela Rodriguez of the Greenville News to highlight the new facility.
  - The playground is being installed and will be open to the public by mid-September.
  - Purchase requisitions were generated for FF&E items.
  - Sod installation, building painting, and landscaping are nearing completion
- ◆ Kids Planet:
  - Red Watson conducted media interviews for the upcoming renovation.
  - On July 11, a meeting was held with Robert Roux and Brandy Blake of the City's Building & Development Standards Department to discuss next steps and permitting. Plans will be submitted for review and it will be placed on the PAC meeting agenda for August 8.
  - Pour in Place colors were selected and a design review meeting was held on July 26 with the playground equipment provider, the Civil Engineer, and the project team from the Recreation Department.
- ◆ Dates were scheduled for the cleaning of office and restroom tile at the Operations Center, and epoxy coating of restroom tile at Victor Gym.
- ◆ An EV Shuttle Program review meeting was held on July 29 at Greer City Hall with Mr. Driggers, Ann Cunningham, Red Watson, and Robbie Davis.
- ◆ The entrance sign to Victor Park and Gym was removed for repair and painting.
- ◆ A pre-bid meeting was held for Victor Gym's HVAC project on July 30.
- ◆ All 15 mobile and facility AEDs were inspected on July 31 as part of the Fire Department's annual inspections.

## Department Trainings

- ◆ Department employees attended NAMI training in July.

## Division Highlights

### Athletics:

- ◆ Cheer for Greer hosted a preseason cheer camp at Pelham Baptist Gym. The camp is a week-long introduction to cheerleading, which is run completely by our volunteers.
- ◆ Division Staff:
  - Completed fall sports registration for Greer Baseball Club, Girls' Softball, and Foothills Soccer Club of Greer. Practices for these fall sports will begin in August.
  - Facilitated All-Star baseball practices at Century Park and Country Club Road Park. Greer Baseball Club had All-Star teams in 6U, 8U, 10U, and 12U age divisions. These teams competed in Dixie Youth State Tournaments throughout the state in July as District 1 Champions. The 6U All-Star team competed in Columbia and won the Dixie Youth South Carolina State Championship. This was the first ever Dixie Youth Baseball State Championship for Greer Parks and Recreation. The 8U National team played in Dillon finishing 8th, the 10U National team played in Anderson finishing 10th, and the 12U team played in Bluffton finishing 6th.
  - Facilitated summer training for the FSCG academy fall soccer teams at Country Club Road Park on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday nights in July in preparation for the upcoming season.
  - Hosted a flag football coaches meeting on July 18 to discuss the upcoming season and complete team rosters. Practices will begin in August at Country Club Road Park.
  - Facilitated youth tackle football conditioning for 8U and 10U age divisions at Century Park on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday nights. Practices for these teams will begin on August 1 at Greer City Stadium.

### Recreation:

- ◆ Interviews were held for a Recreation Leader position available at the Needmore Recreation Center.
- ◆ Questionnaires were sent out to 18 candidates for a new full time Recreation Coordinator position.
- ◆ The 2019 Summer Camps continued in July. Approximately 125 kids per day participate in an 8-week camp at Victor Park and the Needmore Community Center with tons of field trips, activities, games, and crafts.
- ◆ The Recreation Division continued to facilitate the following programs:
  - Senior Action – Needmore Recreation Center, Mondays-Fridays (200 participants monthly)
  - Never Alone – Tryon Recreation Center, Tuesdays (80 participants monthly)
  - Cutlery Club – Tryon Recreation Center (20 participants monthly)
  - Artifacts Club – Tryon Recreation Center (74 participants monthly)
  - Pickleball – Victor Gym and Tryon Tennis Courts, Tuesdays and Thursdays (250 participants monthly)
- ◆ SOAR (Seniors Out and ARound)
  - On July 9, members met at Victor Gym and had delicious snowcones from Pinguinos Hermanos. There were 10 seniors in attendance for this fun outing.
  - SOAR had four Line Dance Classes this month on July 10, 17, 24, and 31 with an average of 29 seniors in attendance.
  - The monthly Movie Day was held on July 15. This month's movie was the drama, "The Professor and the Madman". There were 28 seniors in attendance to watch this wonderful movie.
  - Bingo was held on July 18 and 23 with an average of 24 members in attendance.
  - On July 26, a group of 16 members visited the Greer Heritage Museum. A great time was had by all while learning about Greer's rich history. After the museum visit, the group had a delicious lunch at Ira's Chicken.
  - Lunch Bunch this month was held on July 30 at Kustom Krust. There were 26 seniors in attendance to enjoy great pizza and fellowship.
  - The average attendance for the month was 22.

## Cultural Arts:

- ◆ Robin Byouk conducted tours of the Center for the Arts with Crescom Bank's April Staggs, Jim Boyd, and Mindy Calvert, Citizens' Building and Loan's Jennifer Jones, Carlos Bulnes Metal Art, and Tom Ebetino and Truman Henderson.
- ◆ Jennifer Mills's artwork was hung in the Wall Gallery at City Hall.
- ◆ Camp ARK held Beginner Camp at the Tryon Recreation Center July 8-11 with a theme of 3-Ring Circus. Advanced Camp was held July 15-18 and 22-25. Attendance reached capacity at both camps. The Advanced Camp prepared the play Willy Wonka Jr to be performed at the Cannon Centre.
- ◆ Tunes in the Park had 3 very well attended nights in July. Greer Idol and Greer Idol Jr were held each week and drew a large crowd. The most attended week featured Mac Arnold and Plate Full O' Blues.
- ◆ Robin Byouk and Sara Odom met with 2 furniture companies and 2 blinds companies to get quotes for the Center for the Arts.
- ◆ Greer Children's Theatre held auditions for Beauty and the Beast at the Tryon Recreation Center on July 22 and 24. Callbacks were held July 27. The cast list will be posted in August.

## Events:

- ◆ The Events Division hosted 58 events, at which nearly 8,735 guests visited the City of Greer Events Center.
- ◆ The Parks and Recreation Department completed its 11th season of Moonlight Movies in the Greer City Park Amphitheater. The 8-week movie series hosted over 800 guests each Thursday night and continues to grow in popularity.
- ◆ The Greer Farmers Market will continue on Saturdays through October with assistance from the Events Division. The weekly market averages 35 vendors and about 500 guests.
- ◆ The Events Division Ambassador Program has continued to build awareness. July was the biggest month this year in ridership, with over 1,900 riders. The shuttles run Tuesday–Saturday from 11am-2pm and 6pm-9pm, and Sundays 10:30am-3:00pm.

## Grounds Maintenance

- ◆ Trees Greenville installed new mulch to recently-planted trees throughout the disc golf course at Century Park.
- ◆ Dreamscapes Landscaping installed new landscaping at Tryon Recreation Center. Staff installed the drip irrigation system for this site.
- ◆ Division Staff:

# City of Greer Parks & Recreation Department

## *Monthly Report for August 2019*



*Cheer for Greer began practices in August at Greer City Stadium.*

### Department Projects

- ◆ Center for the Arts:
  - Bi-weekly construction meetings were held.
  - Hogan Construction is working on the completion of punch list items for the park. Installation of building signage was started by SignSouth.
  - Staff met with A-Oak Farms on August 14 to discuss Christmas decorations for the building.
  - Staff is installing FF&E items as they are received.
- ◆ Kids Planet:
  - BlueWater Civil Engineering is finalizing grading and site documents. They plan to submit them to the Parks and Recreation Department and GCRA for review in mid-September and advertise for bids the following Sunday.
  - Final color selections for the playground equipment have been submitted. A surveyor was brought back to add detail to the survey for the Civil Engineer to finalize plans and construction documents. Shealey Electric submitted a photometric plan for park lighting to Recreation staff for review.
  - Kids Planet will officially close on Tuesday, September 3. Department staff will be on site that day to begin the removal of pickets, tiles, painted boards, etc. Staff met with Chad Richardson of the Police Department and Steve Owens, the City's Communications Manager, last week to discuss security and communication for the project. Kudos to Steve for creating a Kids Planet page on the FutureGreer website and for designing banners that will be displayed on the fence along Brushy Creek Road. An LED sign was placed in the parking lot in August announcing the impending closure.
- ◆ Entrance sign installations at Country Club Road Park and South Suber Road Park are complete, as is the repairing and repainting of the entrance sign at Victor Gym.
- ◆ New lines were purchased for the clay tennis courts at Tryon Recreation Center.
- ◆ A bid opening was held at City Hall on August 7 for the HVAC system at Victor Gym. City Council gave approval to award the project to RSI of the Carolinas on August 13.

- ◆ Department employees attended NAMI training in August.

- ◆ A Recreation Board meeting was held at City Hall on August 22.
- ◆ Department staff met with members of the Police Department and Public Services as well as Chamber staff on August 23 for a build-out meeting regarding Blues on the Green, and again on August 26 for an on-site walk through.
- ◆ Justin Miller met with the Park Hop Committee on August 26 to discuss the closing ceremonies and park hop levels for various prizes for the 2019 summer program.

- ♦ Robin Byouk and Sara Odom toured the SC Inland Port on August 28 with one of the student winners from the 2019 Juried Art Show, whose piece was purchased by the Inland Port.
- ♦ GCAC has been planning the Fundraising Gala for the Center for the Arts to be held on September 20. There will be a full slate of internationally renowned performers including: Emile Pandolfi, pianist; Jared Emerson, painter; Noah Guthrie, singer/songwriter; Greenville Dance Collaborative; and Christina Laurel, paper artist.

### Department Projects

- ◆ Center for the Arts:
  - The Greer Cultural Arts Council held a fundraiser on Friday, September 20, "*Spotlight on the Arts Gala*". There were approximately 140 people in attendance that enjoyed entertainment provided by Emile Pandolfi, Noah Guthrie, and Jarod Emerson.
  - The Grand Opening of the Center for the Arts was held on Saturday, September 21. A Dedication Ceremony was held at 10:45am, followed by entertainment and activities inside the facility and throughout the park from 11:00am–4:00pm, that included tours, pottery wheel and origami demonstrations, inflatables, balloon animals, open studios, and indoor and outdoor entertainment.
  - On Sunday, September 22, tours were available to the public from 1:00pm–5:00pm. Approximately 225 guests attended.
- ◆ Kids Planet:

Bids were accepted from Sterling Structure, Martin & Son Contracting Inc., and Wilma's Pump & Tank. Staff will follow up with each company that submitted a bid to review information contained in their bid packets such as references, pricing, required permitting and licensing, etc. and make a recommendation to City Council to award the bid in October.
  - Department staff members are working with Greer CPW to disconnect and remove all security lighting and light poles from Kids Planet.
  - Staff will look into preventive measures during demolition and construction to save trees not marked for removal.
  - BlueWater Civil Design is planning to submit all plans for full review to the City of Greer in October.



- ◆ Staff is working with Jonathan Nett of Civil SD to develop site plans for the outdoor restrooms at Turner and Victor Fields, and the accessible parking area at Turner Field. Mr. Nett is also working with the City of Greer in designing ADA accessible parking at Springwood Park.
- ◆ Bathrooms floors at Victor Gym had an epoxy covering installed over the existing floors.

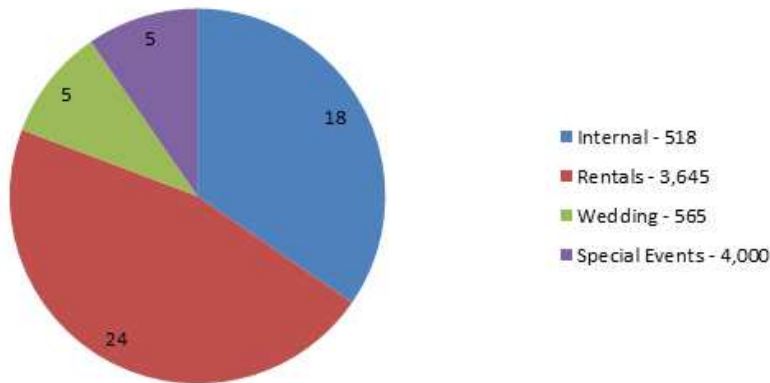
### Cultural Arts:
