<u>Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC)</u> – Robin Byouk, Cultural Arts Supervisor on *behalf of Mandy Holbrook*

- The Greer Cultural Arts Council (GCAC) hosted three weeks of summer camps at the Center for the Arts. The last two weeks of camps in July reached full capacity.
- GCAC has been Freedom Blast's beverage provider since the beginning, and this year's sales were better than last year's. Two of the three Pepsi trailers sold out of product. GCAC also provides volunteers to help with Tunes in the Park and sells Pepsi and beer products at the event.

Golf Committee – Bill Harrill, Greer Golf Adhoc Representative

• We are currently on pause patiently waiting for the golf course and clubhouse renovation to be completed. I can't express how much the course has changed for the better since the City has gotten involved. We appreciate all the hard work from Red (Watson), Ann (Cunningham) Jim (Young), and Sam (Merrell). I also want to thank Steven Thompson and the Grounds crew for transforming that golf course. We have many new faces and young people playing our course which bodes well for our community and the game of golf. "I'm a lifelong resident of Greer and I can't tell you how proud I am of everyone in this room for what the City of Greer has done in our community. Everything you do is first class, and I want to thank you for everything you do."

Departmental Updates

Athletics Division - Cory Holtzclaw, Athletics Supervisor

Greer Baseball Club

- Greer Baseball Club Spring and fall 2024 seasons passed over the 750 total participants mark for the year. Typically, in any given year the number varies from 575-650.
- Greer Baseball Club Spring 2024 regular season concluded. Each spring season begins with the Greer Diamond Dirt Classic tournament, followed by regular season games, and then the final playoff tournament, the Greer Upper State.
- Greer Baseball Club offers these programs in the following age divisions: 4U Tee Ball, 6U Coaches Pitch, 8U Coaches Pitch, 10U 46/60, 12U 50/70, and 14U 60/90.
- Greer Baseball Club claimed another state championship. This year our 12U Greer Baseball Club all-stars won the 12U South Carolina DYB state title. They will now head to Shreveport, Louisiana to represent the State of South Carolina and Greer. The Greer Baseball Club also garnered three District 1 championships and one top-three state finish in 10U.

Greer Softball Club

- Our 2024 spring regular season concluded at Victor Park. We look forward to playing at our new home, Turner Park, currently under construction.
- Greer Softball Club players competed in a large municipal league comprised of teams from Mauldin, Simpsonville, Fountain Inn, and Greer recreation softball teams.
- Greer Softball Club's All-Star teams participated in district all-star tournaments this summer. Although the teams were competitive, none of them placed in the top 3.

Greer Tackle and Flag Football

- Greer PRT Tackle Football registration has concluded. All youth tackle football players will begin conditioning this week at Greer City Stadium. Players reported yesterday to weigh-ins, sizing, and acclimatization conditioning.
- Greer PRT NFL Flag Football registration concluded as well. Practices will begin in August with league play underway in September and October.
- Close to 300 players will be participating in either flag or tackle this upcoming fall 2024.

Greer 76ers Junior and High School Rugby

- The Greer 76ers Junior Summer Flag program is currently underway at Country Club Park. This program provides an opportunity for our coaches to reach athletes interested in participating this winter in our youth tackle program. This past fall was our first-ever season offering junior tackle rugby. Junior 76ers program director, Andy Garcia, is hopeful to offer 10U and 12U tackle teams this upcoming winter.
- Registration began for the 2024 Greer Christmas 7s National Rugby Tournament. Greer PRT will host and facilitate the event at Country Club Park on December 7&8.
- Registration for the upcoming Varsity and JV Boys Rugby program begins on August 1, 2024.

Cheer For Greer

• Cheer for Greer registration is complete. Summer Cheer Camp is currently underway at the Cannon Centre. Volunteers train participants in stunts, cheers, and dances for the upcoming season. All three age divisions are currently on waiting lists.

Foothills Soccer Club of Greer

- Foothills Soccer Club of Greer (FSCG) Academy teams are practicing at Country Club Park for the fall '24 season. The Academy 17s won the South Carolina State Cup and advanced to the national tournament in Texas.
- Foothills Soccer Club of Greer Recreation teams will begin practice on August 12 at Suber Road Soccer Complex. We currently have waiting lists for all divisions.
- On average the FSCG Academy and Recreational League programs have 500 participants per year.

American Legion

- Greer PRT staff facilitated all home Junior and Senior American Legion games at Stevens Field.
- The Greer PRT Senior Legion team is currently in the middle of a playoff run that will hopefully conclude with a state championship.
- Since our last meeting the athletics division has hosted numerous rentals including youth baseball tournaments, men's rugby matches, and soccer matches.

<u>Cultural Arts Division</u> – Robin Byouk, Cultural Arts Supervisor

- The Friends of Lake Robinson art show was exhibited at City Hall in the Wall Gallery during May and June. Additionally, we displayed photographs of Greer Veterans for Freedom Blast.
- Our staff had two The Asian American Pacific Islander artwork was displayed in the gallery at the Center for the Arts during May and June. The Expressions of Valor Veteran art show was exhibited at the Center for the Arts in June and will be removed at the end of July.
- The first Tunes in the Park on May 18 was canceled due to inclement weather. The Carolina Coast Band performed on June 15 and the Mighty Kicks on July 20 both events were well attended.
- Greer Idol and Greer Idol Jr started with 11 contestants and they will all stay through until August 15, (due to rain cancellations) at that time we will have 5 contestants continue until August.
- Clay classes are scheduled for Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. We are in the process of interviewing additional ceramics instructors as our main instructor is leaving in September.
- Staff assisted with organizing entertainment for Freedom Blast and contributed to the design of the event's t-shirt.
- The Foothills Philharmonic performed at the Center for the Arts on Saturdays June 15 and July 13 at lunchtime. Both events were standing room only.
- We have two openings for artists in residence and are accepting applications until July 31, 2024.

A total of 225 events brought about 68,140 people to Greer City Park.

- Moonlight Movies kicked off its summer series on June 6 and has been a great success throughout the season. Abbott's Frozen Custard has been on-site selling concessions. The Moonlight Movies series will continue every Thursday through August 1. A highlight from the last scheduled movie on Thursday, July 11, was a screening of Frozen. Attendees enjoyed a special snowy surprise with snow machines on stage and a visit from Anna and Elsa.
- The Greer Farmers Market summer series has continued to see at least 1,000 guests in attendance each week. Guests were invited to enjoy offerings from more than 40 different market vendors, live music, and food trucks. Each market features a scheduled event such as the Peach Cook-off. The market is scheduled every Tuesday through August 27th at Greer City Park.
- Freedom Blast was a tremendous success, continuing to grow in popularity and attendance each year. This year, the event attracted over 25,000 attendees, showcasing the community's enthusiasm and support for our veterans and service members. Thank you to all departments and staff for their hard work. Your efforts were instrumental in making this event a great success and providing a memorable experience for everyone involved.
- Our Ambassadors continued to support local restaurants, shops, and businesses in downtown Greer Station by transporting over 3,500 people throughout the year.

<u>Greer Golf</u> – Red Watson, Assistant Director of Parks, Recreation & Tourism on behalf of Jim Young General Manager, Greer Golf.

- Grounds Maintenance has been busy preparing the course for our upcoming tournaments. Here's a summary of what was done:
 - Added additional patches of sod to the greens
 - o Rebuilt a section of the wall on the #2 green
 - o Core-aerified and top-dressed tee boxes and greens
 - o Applied several applications of liquid fertilizer to the greens
 - o Verti-cut the greens twice
 - Added cart path yardage stripes to the cart paths
 - O Added a water line to service the new driving range and trash containment area
- Grounds Maintenance is working with Gordon Langley to schedule all reel grinding on the mower blades for the next fiscal year. This will be a huge help and free up more time for Steven Thompson, our Grounds Superintendent, to manage the golf course.
- Greer Golf hosted the BMW Charity Pro-Am kickoff event on Saturday, June 1. Hundreds of people attended and enjoyed free clinics, inflatables, face painting, vendor booths, and food.
- The staff moved back into the clubhouse Pro Shop on Thursday, June 6.
- We have relocated our cart fleet operation to the newly renovated basement.
- We have increased our fees slightly for the new fiscal year. Cart and greens fees went up \$1 each, and memberships went up approximately \$10 per month.
- We are excited to announce that our next restaurant tenant will be White Wine & Butter. We expect them to open in late August/early September.
- Our new golf cart fleet was delivered on Tuesday, July 16. The carts are a newer version of our previous fleet and have been very well received by our customers.
- Our parking lot was re-striped on July 23 by the Public Services Department.
- Revenue for the 2023-24 fiscal year was \$1,180,125.97. This is 24% over the budgeted amount, and over \$190,000 more than last year's total revenue. This marks the first fiscal year that Greer Golf has recorded more than \$1,000,000 in revenue. We recorded \$82,647 in profit (revenues over expenditures) and this is our best fiscal year to date.
- We are hosting the Greenville County Amateur tournament this weekend and the Greater Green Open on August 17 & 18.

Recreation Division – Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- Summer Camp at the Needmore Recreation Center had 60 kids enrolled in the program.
- Tournaments
 - o Hosted 2 disc golf tournaments at Century Park (3 this year with 3 more on books)
 - Hosted 3 Pickleball Tourneys at Tryon Park (4 this year)
- Elections- In addition to the state primaries, we hosted the early voting and the general primaries with about 1800 voters.
- The Eagle Scout project at Veterans Park A flag retirement program that provides a bin/box placed in various locations around the city, typically made of wood, possibly hardy board, and painted in an American flag motif. Members of the community can deposit flags to be properly retired by this scout group. We have informed the American Legion and DAV of our intentions so they can share the information at their next meetings.
- Congratulations to Christie Hornbeck for her outstanding performance in our outdoor Archery Program. Last weekend, she emerged as the champion of the 2024 S3DA Eastern Outdoor Target National Championship in Williamsburg, Kentucky. She persevered through 5 rounds, including 3 eliminations to secure the National Championship in her division.
- Recreation Rentals since we last met in April:
 - o Recreation Centers 3266 total for this year
 - o Kids Planet 309....493 total for this year

Tourism Division – Lindsey Shaffer, Tourism Specialist

- The Tourism Division participated in the BMW Charity Pro-Am on June 6 June 9 at the Discover Greer tent. We gave away over 600 branded Greer Golf chapstick golf balls and over 400 Discover Greer fans with a QR code linking back to the website. We received multiple comments complimenting Greer Golf and the renovations. We also spoke with residents from Kentucky, California, and Florida.
- Staff met with the Landrum Welcome Center manager to discuss placing Greer brochures in the state's nine welcome centers. We are working on getting the brochures to those locations.
- Six Special Event Permit Applications were approved:
 - o Three Neighborhood Block Parties
 - o Two Marathons
 - Greer Arts & Eats Festival
- We are currently planning holiday activities to encourage supporting local businesses and visiting downtown. One of those programs is a Holiday Passport where visitors will receive a stamp when they purchase at a participating business and will then be entered for a giveaway with downtown gift cards.
- For Discover Greer, we have had 9,261 website visits and 722 visitor guide views.

Grounds Maintenance - Urban Parks Division – Red Watson, Assistant Director of Parks, Recreation and Tourism *on behalf of Public Services*.

• Athletics

- The Grounds staff and volunteers from the Greer Disc Golf Club installed new disc golf baskets on the course at Century Park.
- Staff prepared the baseball fields for the district tournament held at Century Park baseball fields 1-3 on June 13-17. On Thursday 6/13 and Friday 6/14, 5 employees worked a total of 85.73 hours

• Urban Parks

- Staff created a landscape bed with plants around the existing sign at the Center for the Arts. This area was grass before. 26 different plants were added and double-ground mulch to complete.
- The staff planted over 50 multicolor Garden Phlox throughout downtown as part of the landscape bed renovation. These were planted in the concrete raised beds on Poinsett and in two island beds on Randall/Trade. Additionally, the staff planted 8 Crimson Fire Encore azaleas on Depot St in the island beds in front of Wild Ace.
- Staff installed 46 patriotic banners in Greer City Park, 12 banners at Veterans Park, and
 12 banners at the Center for the Arts Park "Get Your Art On".
- O Staff changed out 36 fountain lights to red/white/blue for the summer season through Labor Day for Freedom Blast, and to celebrate Independence Day.

• Division/Department-wide

- o Grounds Staff installed 32 plants, 1 tree, and 11 cubic yards of mulch, landscape rock, and sod at the city offices on Berry Avenue.
- O All Public Service staff help with set-up, breakdown, and maintaining the trash of Freedom Blast on June 29, 2024. We had thirty-eight Public Service employees working with a total of 485 hours worked.
- The Public Service Stormwater crew added landscape river rock at Century Park to help with the rainfall runoff from the upper sidewalk to the lower driveway.
- Since the last meeting, we have received 9.63 inches of rain, which is +1.78 above the normal amount for the year.

Greer Golf Financial Reports – Red Watson, Assistant Director – Parks, Recreation and Tourism

- Program Funds -We finished the year in great shape. We exceeded our budgeted number for revenue, came in under our budgeted number for expenditures, and finished with a healthy surplus that will go into the cash balance to support programming, projects, etc. in the future.
- PARD Funds- Our requested monies for PARD projects were approved in the current FY budget. We will be meeting with Supervisors over the next month to identify potential projects to be completed over the next year.

<u>Director's Report - Ann Cunningham, Director</u>

Wards Creek Trail System

• The City of Greer is in the process of reviewing the ROW boundary between Greenleaf and Biblebrook Drives with the City Attorney. This ROW may serve as a road and trail system that will connect residents in neighboring communities.

South Tyger River Greenway

• The COG is creating an RFP to advertise for qualified contractors to build Phase 1 of the South Tyger River Greenway. The selected contractor will be required to have experience in trail development and construction.

Victor Park

- Greer PRT will end all programming in Victor Gym and Victor Ball Field on August 31.
 Removing and relocating equipment and materials to other facilities will be completed by the end of August. A date to close the outdoor basketball courts will be determined at a later date.
 We will keep the courts open as long as possible until the dismantling of the goals is done. New outdoor basketball courts will be installed at Stevens Ball Field.
- Currently, we offer programming from Tuesday Sunday. The gym schedule includes open play for basketball and pickleball and a pickleball clinic.

Turner Ball Park

- Construction continues at Turner Park. Our consultants, Keck + Wood, are continuing all construction administration efforts to monitor change orders, pay applications, and general project correspondence.
- Currently, there are some differences between the design survey and the existing ground, and we are working on adjusting the curb line along Virginia Avenue to meet the existing ground correctly with the new parking and curb.
- The lights, bleachers, and shade structures have been relocated from Victor Park.
- The field turf is planned for installation in early August and play is expected to begin at Big Turner Ball Field in September.

Greer Golf - Clubhouse and Pool Area Renovation

- White Wine & Butter Catering has been selected as our new restaurant at Greer Golf. They will be operating the dining room and cabana. Our main goal is to provide a golfer's menu daily and WW&B will have the opportunity to offer other options for lunch and dinner for those visiting the course but may not playing golf.
- We are waiting on the installation of kitchen equipment at the cabana and in the kitchen. We anticipate WW&B will open in late August or early September. We will have a Grand Re-Opening around October 1 and we will make sure you receive an invitation.
- There are some small outstanding items that still need to be completed inside the clubhouse and at the cabana.
- The Public Services Department re-striped the parking lot on Tuesday, July 23.

Wards Creek Trail System

 The City of Greer is reviewing the ROW boundary between Greenleaf and Biblebrook Drives with the City Attorney. This ROW may serve as a road and trail system connecting residents in neighboring communities.

South Tyger River Greenway

 The COG is creating an RFP to advertise to select a qualified contractor to build Phase 1 of the South Tyger River Greenway. The selected contractor will be required to have experience in trail development and construction.

Victor Park

- Greer PRT will end all programming in Victor Gym and Victor Ball Field on August 31. Removing and
 relocating equipment and materials to other facilities will be completed by the end of August. A date
 to close the outdoor basketball courts will be determined at a later date. We will keep the courts open
 as long as possible until the goals are dismantled. New outdoor basketball courts will be installed at
 Stevens Ball Field.
- Currently, Tuesday through Sunday, the inside Gym Schedule allows for Open Play for Basketball, Pickleball, and Pickleball Clinics.

Turner Ball Park

- Construction at Turner Park is ongoing. Keck + Wood, our consultants, are actively managing all
 construction administration tasks, including monitoring change orders, pay applications, and project
 correspondence.
- Currently, there are some differences between the design survey and the existing ground. We are working on adjusting the curb line along Virginia Avenue to meet the existing ground correctly with the new parking and curb.
- The lights, bleachers, and shade structures have been relocated from Victor Park.
- The field turf is planned for installation in early August and play is expected to begin at Big Turner Ball Field in September.

Greer Golf - Clubhouse and Pool Area Renovation

- White Wine & Butter (WW&B) Catering has been selected as our new restaurant operator at Greer Golf. They will be providing food in both the dining room and cabana. Our main goal is to provide a daily golfer's menu and also have the opportunity to offer other options for lunch and dinner for those visiting the course but perhaps not playing golf.
- We are awaiting kitchen equipment installation in the cabana and the clubhouse kitchen. WW&B is
 expected to open in late August or early September, with a Grand Re-Opening scheduled for the
 beginning of October.
- The Public Services Department re-striped the parking lot on Tuesday, July 23.

Athletics

- Athletics facilitated the Greer American Legion Junior and Senior baseball programs at Stevens Field.
- Facilitated Greer Baseball Club practices at Country Club Park and Century Park.
- Competed in the 10U and 12U SC Diamond Youth Baseball State Championships. The event is a 12-team bracket, week-long tournament.
 - o Greer Baseball Club 10U All-Stars competed in Columbia, SC July 6 through July 11.
 - o Greer Baseball Club 12U All-Stars competed in Sumter, SC July 6 through July 11.
 - Greer PRT 12U Greer Baseball Club All Stars are 2024 South Carolina State Champions, and will now represent the State of South Carolina in the Diamond Youth Baseball World Series in Louisiana.
- Greer 76ers Youth Flag Rugby completed their athletics sessions at Country Club Park, leading current junior flag players into the winter tackle season.

ADMINISTRATION:

Wards Creek Trail System

• The City of Greer's attorney is working on acquiring a right-of-way for the first phase of the Wards Creek Trail system. Once this is resolved, we will resume moving forward with the development of this phase.

South Tyger River Greenway

• Keck & Wood consultants are working on a colored rendering for Phase 1A of the trail construction. City staff is creating an RFQ to advertise for qualified contractors in early 2025.

Victor Park

- Greer PRT ended all programming in Victor Gym and Victor Ball Field on August 31. Staff from our department, the Public Services Department, and the Engineering Department are removing and relocating equipment and materials to other facilities.
- A date to close the outdoor basketball courts will be determined later. We will keep the courts open as long as possible until the dismantling of the goals is complete.

Turner Ball Park

- Construction continues at Turner Park. Keck & Wood, our consultant, will continue all construction administration efforts to monitor change orders, pay applications, and general project correspondence.
- Laser grading of the playing field and installation of field turf is complete.
- The curb line along Virginia Avenue was adjusted to meet existing ground correctly with the new parking and curb, and paving for road-side parking spaces. The parking lot should be completed in early September.
- Sod installation for the commons areas began last week and is expected to be completed in early September.



- Staff is working with Greer CPW to enhance parking lot lighting at Greer Golf, because White Wine and Butter plans to operate at night.



City staff is in the process of creating an RFQ to advertise for qualified contractors in early 2025.

Victor Park

- On Wednesday, September 18, the outdoor basketball court goals were dismantled and relocated to the Operations Center for storage. These were the last pieces of property scheduled to be removed before the sale of Victor Park.
- The closing date on the sale of the property was September 26, 2024.

Turner Ball Park

- On September 16, we celebrated the opening of Big Turner Field to begin our fall softball season. Mayor
 Danner and Councilman Bettis welcomed everyone to our newly renovated field and thanked the
 community for their support in improving this great facility. Our four softball teams started the season
 by each having representatives throw out the first pitch together.
- Keck & Wood continues to monitor all construction administration efforts to complete this project for the remaining portion of the park.
- The following outstanding items will need to be addressed before construction is final: sod installation, top-dressing for commons areas, plumbing, and debris removal.
- The parking islands and retention pond sod installation are expected to take place the latter part of this month.
