PROCLAMATION

Mayor Rick Danner and Greer City Council recognize

Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month

WHEREAS, amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, also commonly known as Lou Gehrig's disease, is a progressive fatal neurodegenerative disease in which a person's brain loses connection with their muscles, slowly reducing a person's ability to walk, talk, eat, and eventually breathe; and

WHEREAS, thousands of new amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) cases are reported every year, and estimates show that every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone passes away from ALS; and

WHEREAS, on average, patients diagnosed with ALS survive only two to five years from the time of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, the exact causes of ALS are unknown and there is no known cure for ALS; and

WHEREAS, people who have served in the military are more likely to develop ALS and die from the disease than those with no history of military service; and

WHEREAS, securing access to new therapies, durable medical equipment, and communication technologies is of vital importance to people living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, the ALS Association is the largest philanthropic funder of ALS research globally and has committed more than \$154 million to support more than 550 projects across the United States and 18 other countries; and

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month provides an opportunity to increase public awareness of the dire circumstances of people living with ALS, acknowledge the terrible impact this disease has on those individuals and their families, and support research to eradicate this disease;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mayor Rick Danner and Greer City Council, do hereby proclaim May 2025 as ALS Awareness Month in the City of Greer.





RZ 25-05 is a rezoning request for one parcel located at 111 Maryland Ave with a total acreage of 3.801 acres. The request is to rezone the property from Suburban Neighborhood to Traditional Neighborhood in order to subdivide the lot for additional residential use.

Surrounding land uses and zoning include:

North: Suburban Neighborhood – residential

East: Suburban Neighborhood – residential, single-family and duplex

South: Rail Road Right-of-Way (ROW)

West: Manufacturing and Logistics – CoG Operations Center

Traditional Neighborhoods surround Downtown Greer and are generally more directly connected to it. Key features include an interconnected street grid and a mix of housing types. 

RESOLUTION NUMBER 10-2025

A RESOLUTION APPROVING OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDING DISTRIBUTION IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE SOUTH CAROLINA OPIOID RECOVERY ACT, S.C. CODE §11-58-10 ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Fund Board ("SCORF Board") was created by the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Act to administer and distribute the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Funds for the purpose addressing and remediating the impact of the opioid epidemic in South Carolina including funds from the Guaranteed Political Subdivision Funds ("the GPS Funds") as set forth in S.C. Code §11-58-50 which must be used for approved opioid abatement strategies; and,

WHEREAS, proposals to be funded from GPS Funds must be submitted to the SCORF Board upon approval by Greer City Council; and,

WHEREAS, the City currently has \$798,367.55 available in GPS Funds to be used in accordance with the South Carolina Recovery Act; and,

WHEREAS, the City received a proposal from the Forrester Center for Behavioral Health ("Forrester Center Proposal"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A," requesting the City allocate \$399,994.00 from the City's GPS SubFund to sustain the Greer Outreach and Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) Clinic pursuant to the budget set forth in the Forrester Center Proposal; and,

WHEREAS, based upon the City's careful review of the Forrester Center Proposal, the City finds that the Forrester Center Proposal complies with the application requirements set forth by the SCORF Board and is for an approved opioid abatement strategy. Therefore, the City approves the request in the amount of \$399,994.00 to be allocated from the City's GPS SubFund to the Forrester Center for Behavioral Health pursuant to terms and conditions set forth in the Proposal attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and Compliance Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "B."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREER, SOUTH CAROLINA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby adopted and incorporated herein as forming the legislative and administrative findings, purposes, and intent of this Resolution.
- 2. The City hereby approves the request from the Forrester Center for Behavioral Health from the City of Greer's GPS SubFund in the amount of \$399,994.00 pursuant to the Forrester Center Proposal attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"** and the Compliance Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit "B"**, the terms of which are incorporated herein as if set forth fully.

- 3. Consistent with the Compliance Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit "B,"** the Forrester Center for Behavioral Health agrees that the GPS Funds allowed herein are subject to line-item severability by the SCORF Board.
- 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately. All orders, resolutions and parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of the conflict, hereby repealed.

COMPLIANCE AGREEMENT FOR THE USE OF GPS FUNDS FROM THE CITY OF GREER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SOUTH CAROLINA OPIOID RECOVERY ACT, S.C. CODE §11-58-10 ET. SEQ.

This Compliance Agreement (the "Agreement")is entered into by the Forrester Center for Behavioral Health, Inc. (hereinafter "Forrester Center"), a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of the State of South Carolina.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2025-___ dated May 13, 2025, the Greer City Council approved a request from the Forrester Center in the amount of \$399,994.00 from the City's GPS Funds allocated to the City from the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Fund Board ("SCORF Board"); and,

WHEREAS, the Forrester Center submitted a proposal, a copy of which is attached to the Resolution as Exhibit "A" ("Forrester Center Proposal") in which it proposed a budget for the use of the approved GPS Funds; and,

WHEREAS, as a condition precedent to receiving the City's GPS Funds, the Forrester Center must agree to abide by the SCORF Board's reporting requirements and agree to line-item severability of the City's GPS Funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the recitals set forth above, and terms of the Resolution 2025-____, the Forrester Center agrees as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. The Forrester Center agrees to abide by all reporting requirements established by the SCORF Board.
- 2. The Forrester Center agrees that the funds allocated from the City's GPS funds are subject to line-item severability by the SCORF Board.

Technical Proposal: City of Greer, MAT and supporting services – The Forrester Center for Behavioral Health, Inc.

1. Clearly identify the geographic area and/or communities that the request for funds will impact, including the population of the proposed service area, the poverty level of the service area.

The service area for this request falls within the City of Greer, SC. According Census Bureau, the population of the City of Greer is 44,387, with a poverty rate of 9.9%

2. Describe any existing efforts (either provided by your organization or others in the community) and explain how this new effort will not be duplicative or will substantially expand existing efforts.

In 2021, The South Carolina Department of Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services (DAODAS) and the state committee, Overdose Education and Naloxone Distribution (OEND), monitoring fatal and non-fatal overdose deaths identified Greer, SC as a persistent "hot spot" for overdose incidents. The Forrester Center (TFC) conducted a needs assessment, uncovering critical gaps in the availability of Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) for uninsured and impoverished individuals with Opiate Use Disorder. Access to local services, including The Phoenix Center in Greenville and The Forrester Center in Spartanburg, was hindered by a lack of public transportation, further exacerbating the problem.

In response, TFC launched Peer Support Specialist Outreach in Greer, focusing on Narcan distribution, presence at Greer Relief, transportation to the TFC clinic, and partnership development with Daily Bread Ministries Greer Soup Kitchen. After a community presentation and subsequent request from the organization's board, TFC developed and implemented a plan to offer MAT services in Greer. A walk-in clinic opened one afternoon per week, providing a service model that included medical care, primary peer support, and supplemental counseling. A USC Upstate study demonstrated that this model was equally effective compared to the agency's main outpatient MAT clinic.

The Greer MAT clinic opened in September 2022 at the Daily Bread Ministries Greer Soup Kitchen, staffed with a Nurse Practitioner, peer support specialist, and tele-counseling. Within months, the clinic expanded to two full days per week and has since relocated to the Neighborhood Impact Center (Greer Relief), now open three days per week for 10-hour days. The clinic staff includes a full-time clinical counselor, case manager, part-time Nurse Practitioner, and 1.5 FTE Peer Recovery Coaches. In December 2024, group Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment services began, further expanding the clinic's offerings to meet community needs.

As a result of TFC's efforts, the OEND Team at DAODAS removed Greer from the state's "Hot Spot" map, recognizing TFC's work as a key driver in this change. In FY24, TFC's Greer MAT clinic provided 2,721 services to 139 unique clients.

3. Please provide a description of any budget, funding or resources that you have received, including dollar amounts that support the foundation of the proposed project and/or are being leveraged to support the proposed project.

The Forrester Center has self-funded this project since its inception in 2019. DAODAS contributed some funding the first year, but that is no longer available. For FY 26 the budget for this program, that includes the additions below, is \$495,226. The requested funding amount is \$399,994. In FY25 to date, the program has billed and been reimbursed in the amount of \$86,952.97. The Forrester Center has budgeted for income for FY26 as \$80,000 reimbursement and the remainder to be covered with alcohol excise tax.

Here are the key reasons additional funding is needed:

- 1. Expansion of Services and Staff: As demand for services grows, particularly with the addition of group SUD services and increased client volume, the clinic must expand its staffing and operational capacity. The addition of two Peer Recovery Coaches at a cost of \$100,000 is essential for supporting the increasing number of clients, ensuring that each individual receives the peer support necessary for successful recovery. Peer Recovery Coaches play a critical role in supporting clients through their recovery journey, helping them build connections, access resources, and maintain engagement with the clinic.
- 2. Sustainability and Financial Gap: While the Greer clinic has made progress toward sustainability, it still faces a significant funding gap. The remaining 70% of the budget is funded through TFC and alcohol excise tax allocations, but these sources are not guaranteed to cover the full operational costs. The additional funding will help bridge this gap, ensuring the clinic can continue to operate at full capacity, offering essential MAT services, and meeting the community's needs.
- 3. **Growing Demand**: The success of the Greer MAT clinic has led to a growing demand for services. To continue meeting this demand, the clinic requires additional resources to scale effectively. Peer Recovery Coaches are an integral part of the treatment model, and increasing their presence is necessary to maintain high-quality, individualized care for each client.
- 4. **Program Stability and Long-Term Impact**: The additional funding will help stabilize the program and ensure that it continues to provide services without interruption. With more Peer Recovery Coaches, the clinic can not only serve a larger number of clients but also ensure that individuals are receiving the comprehensive support needed to maintain long-term recovery. This will have a lasting impact on the community by reducing overdose rates and improving overall public health.

In summary, the requested funding of \$399,994 will help sustain and expand essential MAT services, while the additional \$100,000 for Peer Recovery Coaches will ensure that clients receive the peer support necessary for success in their recovery. Together, these resources will support the clinic's continued success and long-term sustainability, allowing it to meet the needs of the Greer community and beyond.

Identify the approved abatement strategy that will be implemented. Identify if the chosen strategy is initial or continuation. Provide a description of how the identified strategy will be implemented.

The approved abatement strategy is: Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) and other opioid related treatment.

While this initiative is already in place, this will be an initial strategy.

Implementation Plan: The Forrester Center is providing the services in shared office space in the Neighborhood Impact Center. The clinic is open Monday, Wednesday and Friday form 9:00 am – 6:00 pm. It is staffed with an Advanced Practice Nurse Practitioner, Clinical Counselor, Peer Recovery Coach, and Supervisor. Services provided include medication prescribing, clinical assessment, group and individual counseling and peer coaching. To ensure that the needs of the citizens can be met, we are adding 2 additional peer coaches to serves as Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) advisors at the Pelham Campus of Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System (SRHS). They will engage patients in the Emergency Center (EC) and facilitate immediate transfer of care to the MAT clinic.

Process Management: 2,721 services to 139 unique clients

Outcome Measure: According to the ODMAP data, the overdoses and overdose deaths for each year since 2021 were:

2021: 140 overdoses; 13 fatal 2022: 190 overdoses; 38 fatal 2023: 166 overdoses; 24 fatal 2024: 108 overdoses; 17 fatal 2025 Q1: 17 overdoses; 0 fatal

We hope to see the continued downward trend of overdoses throughout 2025. As an outcome measure, there will be a 15% decrease in overdoses and 15% decrease if fatal overdoses for the period of the project, FY26.

Budget Justification:

Personnel: \$305,450

This budget supports the operational and personnel costs for a MAT clinic serving individuals with opioid use disorder (OUD). Christy Hood will serve as the clinical counselor and will provide assessments and group/family counseling. Audrey Colin will oversee all aspects of the program to ensure that goals and objectives are met. Matt Holland and Chris VanSluys will serve as Peer Support Specialists and will provide clients with peer recovery coaching as well as case management. Darci Dimitris is the nurse practitioner and Amy Austin will also be working part-time.

Fringe: \$112,273.74

FICA (7.65%) = \$23,366.74 Retirement (18.56%) = \$56,691.52 Workers Comp (1.38%) = \$4,215.21 Insurance = \$27,999.53

Operating expenses: \$57,291

Mileage is based on the agency approved rate of .70 cents/mile. The monthly rent is \$1,848 and is based on fair market value.

The clinic provides comprehensive services including medication-assisted treatment, behavioral therapy, case management, and care coordination. The budget ensures continuity of care, staff retention, and compliance with evidence-based practices.

Administrative Costs: \$20,212

Based on agency's cost allocation plan.

Total for requested funds: \$399,994

This budget reflects a balanced approach to operating a sustainable, high-quality MAT clinic. It ensures access to lifesaving treatment for individuals with opioid use disorder while maintaining clinical excellence, staff support, and operational integrity.
