- The Greer Children's Theatre presented *The Wizard of Oz* at the Cannon Centre during the last two weekends in October. The last weekend of the show was very well attended, and the last show was sold out.
- The Greer Children's Theater rehearsals for Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Cinderella* (Youth Edition) began in January. The performances for *Cinderella* will be from February 28 through March 9 at the Cannon Centre.

Departmental Updates

<u>Athletics Division</u> – Cory Holtzclaw, Athletics Supervisor

- Athletics has concluded the youth tackle football and cheerleading fall 2024 seasons.
 Cheerleading teams once again performed in front of a packed Bank of America Stadium for the Clemson vs. SMU ACC Championship. Tackle football all-star teams competed in the postseason but ultimately fell short of a district championship.
- The Foothills Soccer Club of Greer Academy Division is currently up and running. Our academy program started practicing last week. The 2024 state tournament was in mid-December. That gives you an idea of what our soccer schedule looks like every year. Soccer literally never stops.
- Completed the Greer Christmas 7s Rugby Tournament December 6- 8th at Country Club Park. This season, our tournament had a good representation from the state of Indiana. 4 teams from that state came to Greer to compete. It's the first year since the inception of our tournament not to have rain.
- Completed the CYR Rugby Festival this past weekend at Country Club Park. Youth rugby teams from North Carolina visited Greer for our first-ever junior rugby tournament.
- This upcoming weekend Greer 76ers Varsity and Junior Varsity teams will compete in our high school rugby festival event at Country Club Park. We will have teams from all over the state coming to Greer. Mostly the coast and, Mt. Pleasant area. This will mark back to back to back weekends of rugby tournaments at Country Club Park, as we also have a rugby event the following weekend.
- Facilitated Tomahawk youth wrestling practices at the Cannon Center. Tomahawk Youth
 Wrestling is one of the largest youth recreational clubs in South Carolina. Team members
 compete in duals and tournaments at the Cannon Center, various high schools, and convention
 centers across the state. The Tomahawk Invitational tournament, one of the largest
 recreational wrestling tournaments in the state, is scheduled for Saturday, February 1st, at
 Greer High School.
- Worked with Greer High School and Head Coach Devin Liferidge to create a basketball camp that focuses on teaching the fundamentals. This upcoming Sunday is our last session at Greer High School. The program has been a great opportunity for kids to grow as basketball players.
- Started 2025 Spring Registration for Foothills Soccer Club of Greer Recreation Division, Greer Baseball Club, and Greer Softball Club
 - Between Greer Baseball and Softball Club participants, we will have right at 510 kids playing a diamond sport this spring in our league programs. All age groups outside of our 4U and 15U divisions are at maximum capacity. We have seen growth in our softball program.
 - Foothills Soccer Club of Greer is currently on a waiting list in every age division. We
 desperately need volunteer soccer coaches. Soccer is one of the easiest sports to fill
 up, but the hardest to recruit help for.

Cultural Arts Division – Sara Odom, Cultural Arts Coordinator

- We hosted our inaugural Day of the Dead Festival on November 2 at the Center for the Arts. We anticipated around 300 attendees, but the turnout reached between 600 and 1,000 people during the six-hour event. The festival featured live entertainment on the auditorium stage all day, with nine artist vendors and four food trucks in the park. Three of the food trucks sold out of food before the event ended. We also offered seven free craft activities we prepared for 200 children, and most of the crafts ran out early.
- In December, we hosted the Gingerbread House Competition, which attracted a record 26 entries—the highest number of participants in the five years we've held this event. Over 100 visitors came to the Center for the Arts to admire the gingerbread houses on display..
- In January, the staff hung the artwork by the Tryon Painters and Sculptors in the gallery. In exchange, the resident artists at the Center for the Arts will showcase their work at the Tryon Painters and Sculptors Gallery later this year.
- Ceramics classes resumed in January following a brief winter break. Studio #6, which was previously a resident artist studio, has been converted into an auxiliary ceramics studio. This additional space enables us to increase the capacity of ceramics classes to 12 students per class. Currently, 10 different clay classes are running at the Center for the Arts throughout the week, every day except Friday and Sunday.

A total of 157 events brought about 16,700 people to Greer City Park

- The Greer Farmers Market Fall Market took place on Tuesday, November 19, with the Chili Cook-Off. Over 12 teams participated in the event, and despite the rain, more than 400 people attended.
- The Supper with Santa event delighted attendees on Friday, December 6, bringing together over 290 City of Greer employees and their families. The festive evening featured photos with Santa, craft stations, and a delicious dinner. The event successfully raised \$1,240 to support the City of Greer Police Department's Cops for Tots program.
- Mayor Danner and Santa teamed up to light up Greer City Park during the Greer Christmas Tree Lighting on December 6. A cheerful crowd enjoyed live musical performances, complimentary craft stations, Christmas train rides, marshmallow roasting, children's activities, food vendors, roaming carolers, and a captivating ice carving demonstration.
- On Saturday, December 7, Breakfast with Santa drew a sold-out crowd of more than 500 families and friends. Laurenda's Family Restaurant & Catering provided a delightful breakfast, while attendees enjoyed meeting Santa, participating in free crafts, and writing heartfelt letters to Santa.
- The Greer Farmers Market Christmas Festival took place on Saturday, December 7, and Sunday, December 8, showcasing over 50 vendors offering a wide range of holiday-themed crafts and gift options.
- The Greer Farmers Market Sunday Brunch took place on Sunday, January 12, from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm at Greer City Park. Guests enjoyed live music and had the chance to explore offerings from over 40 vendors.
- The 23rd Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration Luncheon, held at The Event Halls at Greer City Hall on January 20, 2025, brought the Greer community together to honor Dr. King's enduring legacy. The 11:30 am event featured inspiring performances by local entertainers who shared their talents through music and spoken word, while community leaders joined in demonstrating their commitment to Dr. King's vision. Keynote speaker Dorris "Dee Dee" Wright delivered a powerful address that resonated with attendees, and the luncheon also celebrated the Samaritan Award winners, recognizing individuals who have made significant positive impacts within the community. The event served as both a reflection on Dr. King's work and a call to action for continued progress toward a more just and equitable society.

Ambassadors

The Greer Station Shuttles continued to support our local restaurants, shops, and businesses in downtown Greer Station by picking up over 9,500 people throughout the year.

<u>Greer Golf</u> – Red Watson, Assistant Director of Parks, Recreation & Tourism, on behalf of Jim Young, General Manager, Greer Golf.

- Our grounds staff has rebuilt and repaired the water cooler stations on the course.
- Jonathan Ingle, our new Groundskeeper, started working on November 11.
- Steven Thompson attended the 2024 Carolinas GCSA Conference and Trade Show in Myrtle Beach, S.C., on November 17 20.
- The pro shop staff worked on the spring inventory order.

- White Wine & Butter is now open in a limited capacity. They hosted a private opening on December 19, and we are working with them to plan a Grand Re-Opening in February.
- Despite extended periods of colder-than-usual temperatures, play has been steady. Revenue has been a little bit down, but nothing drastic.
- Grounds maintenance staff "iced our putting greens" to protect them from the frigid temperatures. This is a practice where we run irrigation on the putting greens and allow the water to freeze and form a sheet of ice over the green. The ice creates a barrier that prevents the cold air from damaging the grass.
- Lastly, on November 16, Cody Norris tragically lost his life in a senseless act of violence. Cody has been with Greer Golf/Greer Country Club since 2015 and will be greatly missed.

Recreation Division – Justin Miller, Recreation Supervisor

- GCRA grants- Bi-annual reports are complete, 25-26 Applications are due the first of February, with a training our staff will be attending next week
- Veterans Park An American flag receptacle bin has been installed in the park by Scout Will Ehlich as part of his Eagle Project. We have received a lot of positive feedback about this great addition to our community.
- Disc Golf: We have hosted seven (7) tournaments in 2024 and have already hosted two (2) this month. We have started a glow-in-the-dark Space Race League on Tuesday nights from 6:00 PM to 8:30 PM, running through March 11.
- Tryon Park Pickleball courts- Shade structure, landscaping, and ADA sidewalks have been completed. It looks beautiful.
- Mentor program starting next week- Free program, meets twice a month through May
- 2024 Rentals: Needmore & Tryon Recreation Center 97, Kids Planet Shelter Rentals 822

<u>Tourism Division</u> – Lindsey Shaffer, Tourism Specialist

- The Greer Police Department's Trunk or Treat on Trade took place on Thursday, October 31, and was a huge success. PRT staff participated and decorated a trunk to promote the Day of the Dead Festival, which took place on November 1.
- The Holiday Passport Program took place from November 29 through December 15. A total of 43 downtown businesses participated in the program. We received a great response from the community and gave away gift card packages to three randomly selected passport participants.
- Eleven special event permit applications and one filming permit were approved in 2024.
- Discover Greer had 20,321 website visits, more than double the previous year. The visitor guide was viewed 1,473 times, and we have approximately 22,000 social media followers..
- We received \$11,000.00 in grant funding for tourism marketing for the 2024-2025 fiscal year.

Grounds Report

<u>Grounds Maintenance</u> - Red Watson, Assistant Director of Parks, Recreation, and Tourism, *on behalf of Public Services*.

Grounds Athletics Maintenance

- Applied liquid fertilizer to ryegrass on athletic fields using the In-House Turf Grass Program
- Grounds Spray Tech sprayed pigment paint on the soccer fields at Country Club for the Christmas 7 tournament on December 7, 2024
- Grounds Staff mowed and painted soccer fields at Suber Soccer and Country Club for the President Cup and state soccer games.

- Grounds Staff prep for the adult baseball season and playoffs at Stevens Field
- Public Service staff installed and removed all Christmas decorations throughout the City employees with 17 employees working 244 total hours
- Public Service Staff had 32 employees working 160 hours total, with the cleaning of the roads and parking for the Christmas Parade
- Public Service Staff had 19 employees working the Christmas Tree Lighting
- Grounds Athletics division repaired fencing at Kids Planet, irrigation pump station at Country Club, removed fallen trees at parks, and helped the streets division of Public Service remove trees from roads that accrued from Hurricane Helene

Urban Parks:

- Staff prepped the downtown Urban Park for the Greer Arts & Eats Festival held on October 26..
- Urban Parks was presented the Professional Grounds Management Society (PGMS) National Merit Award for Greer City Park on Thursday, October 16, in Louisville, KY.
- Three staff members worked and cleaned up after the Trunk or Treat event on Trade Street
- Urban Park staff have been working diligently to replace plants throughout City Park and the downtown area. We suffered damage from the hurricane winds, rain, and the drought of the summer when City Park had no irrigation. Approximately \$2,000 was spent on beautifying the urban park by replacing and upgrading plants that needed to be changed, requiring 192 manhours to install.
- Staff members prepared the grounds at The Center for the Arts for the Day of the Dead event on November 2, 2024.
- Our Park staff hung Christmas decorations from November 4-8. For a total of 320 hours.
- Staff removed three (3) overgrown holly bushes at Tryon in preparation for new landscaping around the lower pickleball courts.
 - Landscaping in the front of the lower pickleball courts at Tryon was completed on Thursday, December 19. 8 tons of river rock, 16 yards of mulch, and landscape edging were installed around the new concrete pad area.
- Two staff planted 14 Autumn Bonfire Azaleas in the rectangular rock bed just outside the Fire/Police front offices facing Poinsett Street. This will give the front entrance a deep-red color in Spring & Fall and replace sporadic liriope and old Crepe Myrtle trees in this bed.
- Two staff members pressure-washed the brick road sign at Veterans Park Road and Highway 101, then cleaned the brick wall sign at Tryon. Greatly improving its appearance.
- Rain total since the last time we all met there has been 9.81 inches as of January 13, 2025

Greer Golf Financial Reports – Red Watson, Assistant Director – Parks, Recreation and Tourism

- Our Program Funds are very healthy. Fall sports finished their seasons on a good note, winter wrestling is going very well, and spring sports are off to a fast start with registration.
 - o PARD Funds—We are pleased to announce that our application for PARD grant funds to expand the putting green at the golf course was approved. We will begin the project in late spring. As previously mentioned, we have money left over for PARD, so we are working with staff to identify other potential projects for those funds.
 - We are currently submitting a Recreation Trails Program grant to fund the South Tyger River Greenway project. The application is due next month..

Director's Report - Wards Creek Trail System

• The City of Greer's attorney is continuing to work on acquiring the right-of-way for a trail extending from Biblebrook Drive to Greenleaf Drive. Once this is resolved, we will resume moving forward with the development of this phase.

South Tyger River Greenway

- PRT staff continue to work on the completion of a Recreation Trails Grant application through the SC Department of Parks, Recreation, and Tourism for Phase 1A of the South Tyger River Greenway. The applications are due in February of 2025, and award notifications should be received by May/June of next year. We are asking for a \$100,000 grant with a 20% match (\$20,000) from the City of Greer.
- City staff are in the process of creating a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to advertise for qualified contractors in early 2025..
- An Environmental Study of the property affected by the trail will be conducted next year. The purpose of this study is to analyze and understand the relationship between humans and the natural environment, identify potential environmental impacts of the proposed project or activity, assess the current state of the ecosystem, and promote sustainability.

Turner Ball Park

- Keck + Wood and the City of Greer staff are evaluating the grading around the playground and the slopes within the playground to ensure they were completed according to plan. Both the General Contractor for the renovation of the park and the playground equipment contractor are a part of this process.
- Outstanding items include repairing and recovering the floor in the restroom at Big Turner

Greer Golf Clubhouse and Pool Area Renovation

• We anticipate a Grand Opening in February 2025 in partnership with White Wine and Butter. We are in the planning phase.

January 2025 Monthly Report

ADMINISTRATION:

Wards Creek Trail System

• The City of Greer's attorney is continuing to work on acquiring the right-of-way for a trail extending from Biblebrook Drive to Greenleaf Drive. Once this is resolved, we will resume moving forward with the development of this phase.

South Tyger River Greenway

- The PRT Department held a Community Meeting on Thursday, January 23, at 5:00 pm, in Hall A, City Hall. Twenty-eight (28) people attended, including staff. Many thanks to Mayor Danner and Mark Hopper for attending. Amanda Hopper and Lance Owens from the Recreation Association Board were also in attendance.
- Department staff are working on a Recreation Trails Grant application through the SC Department of Parks, Recreation, and Tourism for Phase 1A of the South Tyger River Greenway. We are asking for a \$100,000 grant with a 20% match (\$25,000) from the City of Greer. Award notifications should be received by May/June of this year.
- City staff is in the process of creating an RFQ to advertise for qualified contractors in early 2025.
- An Environmental Study of the property affected by the trail will be conducted in February/March of
 this year. The purpose of this study is to determine if there are any endangered wildlife or plants on
 the property so they will be protected and to mitigate negative impacts and promote sustainability.

Turner Ball Park

- Outstanding items include repairing and recovering the floor in the new restroom at Big Turner.
- Keck + Wood, Cunningham Recreation and the City of Greer staff are evaluating the slopes within the playground to ensure they were completed according to plan.

<u>Greer Golf – Clubhouse/Pool Area Renovation and Bridge Replacement</u>

- White Wine & Butter is planning a Grand Opening for February 20, 2025.
- Staff has decided to have the Grand Opening event for Greer Golf on April 5 from 3:00 p.m. until
 6:00 p.m. We will have music, games, and informational tents on the turf space at the Cabana and miniclinics for "quick tips" every 15 minutes on the putting green and at the driving range.
- Department staff are working with the Capital Projects Division in the replacement of the bridge on hole #12.

Stevens Field Outdoor Basketball Courts

 Department staff are working with the Capital Projects Division in the design and build of the outdoor basketball courts at Stevens Field.

DIVISIONS:

Athletics

• Spring 2025 registration has been completed for the 4U, 6U, 8U, 10U, and 12U Greer Baseball Club Leagues; 8U, 10U, and 12U Greer Softball Club Leagues; and the U6, U8, U10, and U12 Foothills Soccer Club of Greer Leagues. These programs are currently on waiting lists.

- Our girls' softball program is back on track with the completion of Turner Park. Softball families are excited to have a new home and are looking forward to the upcoming spring season.
- The Middle School and High School Leagues, including 14U Softball and 15U Baseball, are still registering and will not close until all local middle schools and high schools finalize their cuts.
- The Rugby South Carolina and Charlotte Youth Rugby Tournaments were hosted at Country Club Park. Country Club Park hosted four straight weekends of rugby (youth, high school, and men's rugby).
- The Tomahawk wrestlers competed in South Carolina Youth Wrestling Association events around the state and placed in multiple events. They also participated in wrestling duals at the Cannon Center. The duals provided participants with skill-based matchmaking opportunities. Registration for the Tomahawk Invitational Wrestling Tournament was completed, and all divisions and weight classes are now full, with the tournament on a waiting list.
- Foothills Soccer Club of Greer Academy practices at Greer City Stadium. The program alternates between Suber Park and Greer City Stadium, depending on the season.
- Athletics staff attended a training workshop with the National Alliance for Youth Sports.
- The athletics division is hopeful that Country Club Park and Century Park will have operational stands run by Greer PRT Athletics Division employees by Opening Day (Saturday, March 29). We have collaborated with the Finance and IT departments to implement paperless concession sales at the parks this season. All stands will be inventoried by the Athletics Supervisor each week during the season, and at the end of the season, we will evaluate our concessions program.
- All facility rentals have been completed.
- We concluded the youth basketball camp in partnership with the Greer High School coaching staff.
 Participants trained for 90-minute sessions at Greer High School with the head coach of the women's and men's high school basketball teams for three months. This camp certainly did not replace our program, but it provided value to our basketball community.

Cultural Arts

- Due to the classroom move, we have increased the clay class size from 8 to 12 students. We now have four instructors, and most classes are full. Clay classes are held on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. Monday classes did not meet on MLK Day.
- Staff worked on preparing summer camp information and advertising for posting. Registration for Arts in Action Summer Camp is now open online through the GCAC website.
- Staff also worked on the 2025 Juried Art Show information, graphics for future events, and facilitating an upcoming rental.
- On Tuesday, January 21, we held a free painting session for community members to come in and paint rocks in memory of their pets for the Rainbow Bridge Rock Garden at the Center for the Arts. Due to inclement weather that night, we ended the painting session an hour early. While the majority of those who had signed up were not able to attend, we were still able to have six rocks painted for the rock garden. We plan to reschedule a make-up rock painting session in the near future.
- New artwork was received on Saturday, January 3. This exhibition is a trade with the Tryon Painters and Sculptors of Tryon, NC. Their gallery is under construction during January and February, so our artists in residence will display their work in their gallery in May. The artwork will be on display at the Center for the Arts through mid-February. Staff hung the show urgently to ensure it was in place before visitors from the City of Goose Creek arrived. The art reception for the Tryon Painters and Sculptors Art Exhibition was held at the Center for the Arts on Tuesday, January 14, with approximately 45 people in attendance.



Wards Creek Trail System



- Southern Dance Connection rented the Center for the Arts on Sunday, March 23, for their Spring Dance Recital.


- On Tuesday, March 25, Robin, Sara, and Fairis spent the day in Charlotte, NC, visiting the Mint Museum. Events

- 33 total events- Internal: 9, Rental: 20, Special Events: 1, Wedding Event: 3
- The Greer Farmers' Market was held in City Park on Sunday, March 9, with approximately 500 people in attendance.
- The Events Division is currently planning and finalizing spring and summer festivals and events, such as Easter Eggtastic, International Festival, Greer Alive, and Moonlight Movies.
- From March 25-27, teachers and administrators from seven local elementary schools attended a three-day Leader in Me Conference at the Cannon Centre and Event Halls.
- Greer Alive (Food Truck Rollout) took place on March 28, 2025, in Greer City Park and was a successful
 event, attracting a great turnout. The Brooks Dixon Band provided live music, and six food trucks
 offered a variety of food options. Eight local vendors were also on-site showcasing their products.
 Greer Relief partnered with us to provide adult beverages, and guests enjoyed putt-putt golf provided
 by a new vendor, Rolling Greens, during the event.
- The Events Division hosted the Rogers Group for another training, with over 300 people in attendance at the Cannon Centre on Monday, March 31.
- In March, the Ambassadors provided excellent customer service, assisting just under 750 passengers in downtown Greer Station.

Golf

- The Upstate SC Amateur Players Tour was held on March 15 at Greer Golf.
- Greer Golf hosted to the JAASC (Japan American Association of South Carolina) Charity Tournament on March 28 with 100 players. The tournament went well and we received numerous compliments on the upgrades to the course.
- We recorded \$123,564.51 in revenue during the month of March. This was \$45k more than last month and \$33k more than last year's total for March.

- SOAR hosted four Wednesday Line Dancing sessions with 89 in attendance at the Tryon Recreation Center; a Hand and Foot card game day on March 12 and March 26 at the Tryon Recreation Center with 15 seniors; a book club meeting on March 18 with 8 participants at the Center for the Arts; a movie Day on March 10 at City Hall with 10 seniors; a stroke prevention luncheon on March 4 at City Hall with 12 seniors; and two Bingo Days at City Hall on March 6 and March 20 with 52 seniors in attendance.
- SOAR took a Lunch Bunch trip to Tryon, NC, and ate at Side Street Pizza and shopped downtown with 30 participants.
- The Palmetto Cutlery Club monthly meeting was held on March 4 at the Tryon Recreation Center.
- Pickleball open-play sessions, Adaptive Pickleball sessions, and one Pickleball Tournament were hosted at Tryon Recreation Center.
- Hosted a Disc Golf Tourney on March 1 at Century Park with 77 participants.
- The Needmore Afterschool program and Creative Advancement program continued at the Needmore Recreation Center and Tryon Recreation Center, respectively.
- The South Carolina Treasure and Artifacts Club held its monthly meeting on March 24 at Tryon Recreation.
- Hosted the Disabled American Veterans Group for their monthly meeting on March 25 at Tryon Recreation.
- On March 6, Kidokinetics started a new program at Tryon Recreation Center that will meet every

- Staff conducted an initial phone meeting on Tuesday, March 11 with a South Carolina content creator to discuss a potential marketing campaign to take place in late summer or fall. The campaign will feature lodging, dining, and entertainment in Greer.
- Lindsey Shaffer met with the BMW Charity Pro-Am on Wednesday, March 12, to confirm plans for their tournament kickoff event taking place downtown on Sunday, June 1.
- Staff completed a budget and event proposal for the City of Greer's upcoming 150th Anniversary (March 2026).
- Lindsey Shaffer met with Mandy Jo of Creative Slingers of Ink on Thursday, March 20, to discuss an
 upcoming book festival taking place at the Historic Greer Depot in October. The event will feature
 around 30 authors of multiple genres. A special event permit is required to have food trucks in the
 parking lot.

- Staff attended TATT's Upstate Connect on Friday, March 21, and toured the new Spartanburger's Fifth Third Park.
- The April Discover Greer Newsletter was published on Tuesday, March 25, and featured the Greer Golf Grand Reopening Event, downtown shuttle information, the reopening of Harvest Kitchen, upcoming events, and more.
- Discover Greer advertisement designs for the GSP International Airport and the Greer Chamber's Greer Map were finalized on Monday, March 31. The designs feature Greer Station, dining, and Greer Golf.
